Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B) 4th February 2018

Readings: Job 7:1-4, 6-7***1 Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23***Mark 1:29-39

She began to wait on them

In today's Gospel, immediately after Jesus healed Simon's mother-in-law, she got up and began to wait on them. The word 'them' is important here. It is in the plural form. She was serving Jesus as well as his disciples. Using this as the significant point, I would like to talk about the importance of the returning of love and of passing it on.

Jesus restored the health to the mother-in-law of Simon so that she didn't suffer any more. For her, it was an enormous gift from Jesus and an expression of Jesus' love for her. And her way to return the love that Jesus had showed her was to wait on Him. I believe she did this with love.

In our earthly life, it is unavoidable to have some difficulties at times. When in difficult situations, we might have received various levels of help from others. People helped us because of the love they had in their hearts. After receiving help, it is always important to keep in mind how we can repay people, particularly when they are in need. Within our capacity, what we repay need not be the same quantity or value of what we have received. We should respond according to the situation and do as much as we can to repay others. We shouldn't calculate the difference between what we have received and what we are going to repay according to secular standards. And of course, the sooner we do that, the better. The Gospel tells us that just after the mother-in-law of Simon was cured, she began to wait on them. It means that when she was able to do something in return, she did it. As Christians, we not only need to follow the principle of repaying all our benefactors but also ought to do this as soon as we can.

It is easy to understand that Simon's Mother-in-law waited on Jesus in thanksgiving and repayment. Then, why did she wait on the disciples as well? Just because they were Jesus' disciples? Of course not. Actually, in my view, she was passing Jesus' love on to the disciples through this simple action. Therefore, we not only need to repay what others do for us out of love, we also need to pass on the love we have received, not just let the love stay with us. In so doing, love will be spread among people who will be enriched by that love. Over a long period of time, the kingdom of God will definitely be built based on love.

Dear friends, through the simple action of this lady, we can learn the principle of giving back to those who have helped us in. And also, we understand the importance of passing love on to others. From now on, in Christ's love, let us try our best to return love with love and pass love on to people around us, too. By doing this, we are turning our secular society into the kingdom of God.
