First Sunday of Lent—Year A 5th March 2017

Pastor's Note:

The gospel of the first Sunday of Lent tells us the story of Jesus overcoming the temptations from the Evil one. Jesus is true man as well as true God. In the beginning of His public ministry, he was tempted by Satan for three times, which is unbelievable to us. Actually, by his own experiences, he would like to remind us that he, as our Saviour, could be tempted by Satan, then we, as his followers, cannot avoid being tempted on our faithful journey. Therefore, we are not living a life without challenges and difficulties, but one full of tests and temptations. We have to prepare ourselves well for hard times. When that time comes, we won't panic! We will face it fearlessly with the grace of our Lord.

Three times Jesus was tempted and three times he defeated Satan with the Scriptural texts. This indicates that how important it is in making ourselves familiar with the Holy Scripture and how powerful God's word is. That is why we should read the Holy Scripture as many times as we can and attend activities like Bible sharing and Bible study as often as possible. Before we go to Mass, we need to familiarize ourselves with the readings of the Mass in advance, getting our hearts prepared for entering into the word of God during Mass. At Mass, we concentrate upon listening to the word being proclaimed by readers or the Clergy. And we ought to take the homilies delivered by Clergy seriously since the Clergy are chosen by God particularly for the purpose of the proclamation of His word. The Holy Spirit always works through them and their proclamations. By all of these, we will have the strength and the weapons to deal with temptations and other tests when facing them.

When Satan was tempting Jesus, he quoted some Scriptural texts too. This reminds us that the Holy Scripture could be abused and quoted intentionally for a wrong purpose. Only when we read and comprehend the Holy Scripture under the guidance of the Holy Spirit and follow good instructions of the Church on how to read the Bible, we can avoid misreading and misusing the Bible. And when we are tempted by others to quote the Bible wrongly, we can definitely shun being misled.

It's worth noting that it was the Holy Spirit who led Jesus into the wilderness. We cannot ignore that the Holy Spirit played a crucial role in the event that Jesus overcame the temptations. In other words, we not only follow the guidance of the Holy Spirit but rely on His strength. Then we will become really strong spiritually, not fearing the power of the Evil one.

In this special season, Lent, let us follow the steps of Jesus and depend on the Holy Spirit. With the power of God's word, we reflect on our lives and prepare our hearts. At the end of Lent, we hope that we can have a new life in the resurrected Lord.

Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults Prevention and Protection Policy.

In 2014, Archbishop Mark launched the new Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults Prevision and Protection Policy. The central message of the Policy is grounded in the policy statement:

The Archdiocese of Brisbane holds that children, young people and vulnerable adults are a gift from God with an intrinsic right to dignity of life, respect and security from physical and emotional harm.

They are to be treasured, nurtured and safeguarded by all.

This means that everyone in the church must ensure that the fundamental rights of children, young people and vulnerable adults are respected. This will be achieved through

the development of respectful relationships and a commitment to safety, embracing appropriate boundaries, behaviours and practices, in accordance with the Archdiocesan *Code of Ethical Behaviour* and adherence to legislative imperatives of the State.

To meet this commitment, our parish will be required to fulfil a number of compliance matters. Some of these have already been put in place; however your support is needed to ensure that our Parish meets all requirements of the policy implementation.
