## Fair Work and Fair Trade

#### Fair Work

On this Feast of Saint Joseph the Worker, let us consider the importance of the just wage. This is particularly important in today's Australia, where wage growth has been very slow and low-paid workers often experience real hardship.

The Church has stressed the fundamental importance of fair remuneration for work. A just wage will meet the immediate needs of workers and their families and also allow them to save for the future. It ensures the prosperity of a society is shared adequately and that the social, economic and cultural life of the community is allowed to flourish. Workers cannot be valued only by their cost or treated simply as a factor of production. (A Pastoral Letter for the Feast of St Joseph the Worker: May 2018)

In its submission to the Annual Wage Review by Fair Work Australia (2018), the Australian Catholic Council for Employment Relations has noted that for many families the wages safety net has not kept pace with rising costs of living and that the wages safety net for all families has fallen well behind average weekly earnings.

Some of the most marginalised people in our society are the unemployed. The Australian Council of Social Service and the Business Council of Australia have called for both sides of politics to commit to raising Newstart, rather than hand out one-off payments. The payment stands at around \$40 a day, which is considered by many experts to be insufficient to meet the rising cost of living.

The church offers her social teachings that emphasise the need for compassion for those who are the most marginalised in society. The CEO of Catholic Social Services Australia, Fr Frank Brennan says: Jesus gives us a moral compass so that the economy serves the people, not the other way around. (Social Justice Statement 2017-2018)

The Church favours measures that include adequate unemployment benefits to alleviate poverty; assistance for those workers who are made redundant such as retraining programs and; providing financial incentives for the development of new industries and adequate provisions to support job retention in vulnerable industries.

It is the responsibility of each and every one of us to encourage governments to provide as much support as possible for workers and the unemployed. You can contact your local member and your federal member of parliament about these issues. Letters to the editor or comments on social media may also be effective.

## Fair Trade

Fairtrade advocates for better working conditions and improved terms of trade for farmers and workers in developing countries. It's about supporting the development of thriving farming and worker communities to have more control over their futures, and protecting the environment in which they live and work.

Fair Trade farmers, who work in democratic cooperatives and other small business producers of products such as food, clothing, textiles and crafts, receive a minimum price for their produce. In addition, producer organisations receive the Fair Trade Premium. The premium can be invested in wells, hospitals, better farming equipment and sustainable farming methods that can improve the living standards of farmers, small producers and their families.

We can support fairly traded goods by purchasing Fair Trade items in many stores in Australia and overseas. We should research the companies we buy products from and give our support to the ones which have responsible business practices and transparent supply chains.

Your dollar votes can make a difference to the lives of many in the developing world.






