<u>RIP: Veronica Cullen</u> who was a long term parishioner of St Peter's passed away on Thursday. Veronica's Funeral will be held here on Wednesday at a time to be advised.

Saint's Days this week:

9 NOVEMBER: THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA IN ROME

The Lateran Basilica, the cathedral of the diocese of Rome, was dedicated to Christ the Saviour in the fourth century. The anniversary has been celebrated as a feast of the Latin Church on this date since the twelfth century. It honours the local Church of Rome as a link with earliest Christian tradition and as a sign of our communion in Christ.

10 NOVEMBER: LEO THE GREAT, pope, doctor of the church

Died in Rome on this day in 461. Elected pope in 440. Tried to protect the city from the devastation of barbarian invasion. His surviving letters illustrate the leadership and guidance he exercised as bishop of Rome toward other Churches in the West. Remembered for the clarity of his thought on the two natures of Christ, affirmed at the Council of Chalcedon, for his eloquent sermons, and for the prayers he composed for the Roman liturgy.

11 NOVEMBER: MARTIN OF TOURS, BISHOP

Born in Pannonia (Hungary) about 316. Died in 397 and was buried on this day in Tours (France). A catechumen who was in conscience unable to continue with military service. Baptised at the age of eighteen, for a time became a hermit, and then worked to establish monasticism in the West. Bishop of Tours for twenty-five years. One of the first non-martyrs to be venerated as a saint. Widely remembered for his legendary generosity to the poor, for arguing against the persecution of heretics, and especially for his active evangelisation and pastoral care of rural areas.

12 NOVEMBER: JOSAPHAT, bishop, martyr

Born in Vladimir (Ukraine) in 1580. Died at Vitebsk (Belarus) on this day in 1623. A Basilian monk who became archbishop of Polotsk. Worked strenuously to uphold and spread the Union of Brest-Litovsk by which Churches of the province of Kiev, with their Byzantine liturgy and customs, had entered into commu-nion with Rome. In a complex situation of national and religious antagonism, he was killed by violent opponents. Remembered for his energetic pastoral reform and courageous ecumenism.

Volunteers needed: We still have vacancies on our church cleaning teams and now also we are in need of someone who could wash and iron the Church linen once a month. Any helpers would be greatly appreciated. Several of our cleaning groups are down in numbers. Please contact Julie in the Parish office. Social Justice News: In August we have written a letter to Mr. Turnbull, Mr. Shorten, Mr. Scullion. Mr. Vasta, Mr Chalmers and Prof. Jillian Triggs about the high incarceration rates of indigenous people in the justice system and about the mistreatment of children in the Northern Territory Youth Detention Centre. We have received two answers, from Prof. Triggs stating that the Human Rights Commission advocates constantly on these important issues and from Mr.Scullion, the Minister for Indigenous Affairs informing us that the government is spending \$4.9 billion over 4 years to Improve outcomes for indigenous people. Also, the outcome of the Royal Commission into the Protection and Detention of Children in the NT is expected to be completed by 31/3/2017. If you wish to read the letters they are on the church door.

Seminar: During his recent visit, the Archbishop mentioned Fr James Mallon and his book Divine Renovation. Fr Mallon will be presenting a seminar on his book "Divine Renovation - Bringing your parish from maintenance to mission" on Saturday 19th November from 9am to 4pm at San Sisto College. Carina. Fr James will inspire you with his stories of how his Canadian parish, St Benedict's has transformed their parish community to become a more vibrant, welcoming and outwardly focused faith community. He will share about the key strategies that have worked for them as well as their learnings from their challenges and failures. This is a rare opportunity not to be missed to hear this world-leading pastoral practitioner talking about evangelisation, collaborative leadership and growing missionary disciples.
