I am the gate of sheepfold

Many think that either Yahweh described in the Old Testament or Jesus described in the New Testament, are too intolerant, stressing their supremacy over all too much. In the Old Testament, Yahweh required: "the Lord your God you shall fear. Him you shall serve, and by His name alone you shall swear. Do not follow other gods" (Deut 6:13-14). In the New Testament, Jesus also laid stress on that, saying, "Worship the Lord your God, and serve Him only" (Matt 4:10). In today's Gospel, Jesus even said, "I am the gate of the sheepfold", "Anyone who does not enter the sheepfold through the gate, but gets in some other way is a thief and a brigand". By saying this, all other religions and the gods they believe seem to be excluded and negated. According to some people, God should be more tolerant, cooperating with other gods and forming a team with them. Then, more people would be cared about. It seems right when you hear this first without thinking much over it.

Actually, they haven't comprehended that the nature of the God in whom Christianity believes is love (1 Pet 4:7-8, 16). If we have read the Bible thoroughly and tried to comprehend it as a whole, it wouldn't be difficult to find it out that the theme of the whole Bible is love. The Old Testament describes Yahweh as "a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness" (Exod 34:6; cf, Jonah 4:2). The prophets were the spokesmen of God. For many times, they represented God, appealing to the Israelites to love the poor and look after their widows well, which is the practice of love. In the New Testament, Jesus is the incarnation of love. Out of His love for humankind, He has even sacrificed His life for them. Besides that, He has given us a new commandment: "Love one another as I have loved you" (John 13: 34-35).

Therefore, when Yahweh required people "do not follow other gods", it is not that He was selfish or dictatorial, but that He was asking people to set love as the only direction of life. Similarly, when Jesus said He is the gate of sheepfold, He was telling us that we won't be really happy unless we live in love. What God wants to tell us is that the life of love is not a choice, that we may or may not need, but the only way for a happy life. Apart from love, there are no other ways.

And a religion is a social organization. It is very clear that God wouldn't be confined by any social organizations since He is infinite and transcends everything. It must be understood that whoever has love is with God. Just as the first letter of John says: "Everyone who loves is born of God and knows God" (4:7). Again, "those abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them" (4:16). In these texts, we can't see any distinguishing between social organizations. Love is the only standard and principle. In love, we embrace all.

Dear friends, hope we can comprehend our God, our religion and today's Gospel from this perspective. And according to this, we comprehend human life, adjust the direction of life and make plans for life. In love and with love, let us walk together through the gate of the sheepfold, namely, the lifestyle of love, towards God, the fullest and perfect love, eventually being with Him in eternity.
