The Epiphany of the Lord 8th January 2017

Pastor's Note:

The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord:

Matthew 2:1-12. Our Journey and Our Destiny to Jesus.

Epiphany (Greek word Epiphanos means appearance or manifestation or showing forth) has been defined as the manifestation of the God-child to the Gentiles as represented by the Magi. 'Lumen requirunt lumine' from a liturgical hymn for the Epiphany speak of the experience of the Magi: following a light, they were searching for the light. The star appearing in the sky kindled in their minds and in their hearts a light that moved them to seek the great light of Christ. The Magi followed faithfully that light which filled their hearts, and they encountered the Lord (Pope Francis on Epiphany 2014). The destiny of every person is symbolized in this journey of the Magi of the East as they are called in the Gospel. Our life is a journey, illuminated by the lights which brighten our way, to find the fullness of truth and love which we Christians recognize in Jesus, the light of the world. The first reading is from the prophet Isaiah, which echoes the call of God to Jerusalem: 'Arise, shine'. Jerusalem is called to be the city of light which reflects God's light to the world and helps humanity to walk in his ways. This is the vocation and the mission of the people of God in the world (Pope Francis). The angels revealed Jesus to the shepherds, and the star revealed him to the Magi, who had already received hints of him from the Jewish Scriptures. Later at his baptism, the Father revealed him as his beloved Son in whom He is wellpleased. In the synagogue at Nazareth, Jesus revealed himself as the promised Messiah. Finally Jesus revealed himself as the son of God at the wedding at Cana turning water into wine, thus revealing his Divinity. These multiple revelations/epiphanies are all suggested by the Feast of Epiphany.

St Paul in his letter to the Ephesians expresses God's plan in clear terms: "The Gentiles are... co-partners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the Gospel". The Gospel text today reminds us that if God permitted the Magi foreigners and pagans - to recognize and give Jesus proper respect as the king of the Jews, we should know that God has in his love brought us also to Jesus our Messiah. There were three groups of people who reacted to the Epiphany of Christ's birth. King Herod and his people tried to eliminate him; priests and the scribes ignored him and his birth; the shepherds and the Magi followed the vision and insight they had and they came to adore him. On this feast of Epiphany, as we recall and celebrate Jesus' manifestation to humanity in the face of a Child, may we be like the Magi who gazed towards the star and followed the great desires of their hearts. Pope Francis tells us that it is necessary today to guard the faith, and to keep the faith. We must press on further, beyond the darkness, beyond the voices that raise alarm, beyond worldliness, beyond so many forms of modernity that exist today. By the example of the Magi, with our little lights, may we seek the light and keep the faith.

Readings The Epiphany of the Lord

The earliest Christmas feast, originating in the East in the third century and passing to the West in the fourth century. Celebrates the divine "manifestation" or "coming". In the East it commemorates the baptism of the Lord and in the West the visit of the Magi. The mystery of the incarnation is now revealed to everyone in the world, represented by these wise men from foreign lands.

First Reading: Isaiah 60:1-6 The glory of the Lord shines upon you.

<u>Second Reading</u>: **Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6** The revelation means that pagans now share the same inheritance, that they are part of the same body.

Gospel: Matthew 2:1-12 We have come from the East to worship the king.

Readings for next weekend: Second Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 49:3, 5-6 1 Corinthians 1:1-3 John 1:29-34



Monday 9th January is the feast day of The Baptism of the Lord

Formally introduced into the Roman calendar in 1960 on the Sunday after the Epiphany, it now concludes the Christmas season. Commemorates the revelation of Jesus as God's beloved Son, the Christ, anointed by the Spirit.
