Come to Me and I will Give You Rest

We live in a world that is full of noise and distractions. Each day we are burdened by the demands of our everyday lives, which sometimes trap us in an endless routine – a routine that ultimately centres on 'me'. In the little spare time that we might have, the need to be constantly connected through technology such as social media seems to have completely taken over our lives. Of course, our relationships tend to suffer as a consequence to these noises and distractions.

Christianity is first and foremost a relationship with a God who loves us and continue to be present with us. As we know, for relationships to grow and sustain, it must be nurtured. How often do we find quality time to spend with God in our busy lives? If we are not careful, our personal prayer and attending liturgical celebrations can easily turn into a mere routine.

Our Christian lives demand a great deal – serving the poor, evangelization and social justice are just some of the tasks we as Christians are called to embrace. As important as these are, we should not forget our primary call to contemplate the face of Christ through silence and prayer. It is in the silence we experience deeply the presence and the transforming power of God; it is in the silence, we find rest in God's embrace.

Are you tired from your daily burdens? Do you find life just too hard sometimes? Today's Gospel sends a strong message to each of us. God is waiting for us, waiting to receive our burdens, anxieties and troubles, and find rest in him.

In this coming week, let us try and spend some quality time with God each day, handing over our burdens and troubles, so we can find rest in his love. An old hymn sums this up perfectly:

I heard the voice of Jesus say, "Come onto me and rest; lay down, O weary one, lay down your head upon my breast." I came to Jesus as I was, so weary, worn, and sad; I found in him a resting place, and he has made me glad.

Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Sunday: Every year, in July, right across Australia, people observe NAIDOC week. (National Aboriginal and Islander Day Observance Committee)

Indigenous people, together with all Australians, celebrate their spirituality, identity, culture and survival and their contribution to the life of our nation.

This year we are commemorating three very special events in the history of the struggle and advancement of our indigenous people.

On 27/May we celebrated the 50th Anniversary of the 1967 Referendum. Around 90% of Australians voted to give the Commonwealth special powers to make laws for indigenous people and to recognize them in the census.

25 years ago the Mabo Decision was handed down by the High Court of Australia. The Court reversed the principle of Terra Nullius (the doctrine that the land belonged to no one before white settlement) and recognized native title. This led to sweeping changes in the relationship between indigenous people, land-holders, industry and government.

This year also marks the 20th Anniversary of the release of the report on The Stolen Generation. "Our Languages Matter" is the theme for NAIDOC week 2017. Many indigenous languages have died out. This is a great, painful loss. The theme will shine a spotlight on the grass root movements of people who are working hard to recapture their languages as a means of recapturing their culture. We wish our indigenous brothers and sisters every success in this endeavor.

We would like to introduce to you a special artist, Gurrumul Yunupingu, who sings in English but also in his own language, Yolngu. This singer from Elcho Island off the coast off Arnhem Land, was the 2016 Naidoc Week Artist of the Year. His music is pure, deeply moving and powerful. Check out his song "Jesu" on You tube. *The Social Justice Group*
