From the Pastor's Desk

Luke 15:1-32. Forgiveness Is Living the Love and Mercy of God

Perhaps the best depiction of today's Gospel parables is reflected in the painting *The Return of the Prodigal Son* by Rembrandt. The late Henri Nouwen, a great spiritual writer in the late 20th century, in the prologue to his own short book, *The Return of the Prodigal Son: A Story of Homecoming* (1992), wrote of his encounter with that painting at the L'Arche community this way: 'The more I spoke of the Prodigal Son, the more I came to see it as, somehow, my personal painting that contained not only the heart of the story that God wants to tell me, but also the heart of the story that I want to tell God and God's people. All of the Gospel is there. All of my life is there. All of the lives of my friends are there. The painting has become a mysterious window through which I can I can step into the kingdom of God. Henri Nouwen was a professor at Princeton University and at a turn in his life he resigned his prestigious position and joined in L'Arche Community, founded by Jean Vanier. Its communities are households of people who choose to share life together inclusively with those who are mentally and/or physically handicapped.

As we are nearing the close of the great Jubilee Year of Mercy, this Sunday presents to us three great stories of forgiveness, mercy and love by Luke. It is said that Luke has the best portrayal of God's own mercy in his gospel and this gospel is seen as the Gospel of Mercy by many scholars. The popular tittles of these stories that follow show how well-known and loved they are: The Lost Sheep. The Lost Coin and the Prodigal Son (I think this too should have been called Lost Son). The story of the Good Shepherd tells us that when we are lost or in trouble we have to handover the steering wheel, handover control, and be carried back to the personal by God. Robert Musil says it well: The road to the soul does not begin with the mind. If we want to revive our souls, the personal, we have to be carried. It is called grace: we need God to do the work. Carry me Lord. Henri Nouwen concludes this way: As I look at my own aging hands, I know they have been given me to stretch out to all who suffer, to rest upon the shoulders of all who come, and to offer the blessing that emerges from the immensity of God's love. What a great statement from the heart attuned to God.


