Second Sunday of Lent—Year A 12th March 2017

Pastor's Note: "This is my Son ... Listen to Him"

As the Son of God, Jesus lowered himself and took flesh. He did this to bring hope to humankind who had been lost and journeying toward a wrong direction for a long time, to rekindle the fire of love of human beings and to take them back to God's bosom in eternal happiness. In order to fulfil this mission, He called people into his own team. And He was successful in forming a team of twelve, among whom there were three key figures. They would need to be prepared more than the others for more responsibilities and they were Peter, Jacob and John, who were taken up to a mountain in today's Gospel.

On the mountain, these three apostles experienced amazing experiences that they had never ever dreamed of before. They saw the transfigured Jesus: His face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light (verse 2). This was not the common appearance that any other ordinary people could have. And also, this appearance was totally different from the one Jesus had in other times. It indicated how extraordinary Jesus was from all the other ordinary people. He is the Son of God, not like us, ordinary creatures of God, and He came to teach and save humankind.

Apart from that, Moses and Elijah came to Jesus, talking with Him. Moses was a great hero for the Israelite. By following the Will of God, he was successful in leading the Israelite to across the Red Sea and to escape from the Egyptian pursuing forces; And representing the Israelite and the whole humankind, he accepted the Ten Commandments from God, which is the reason that the whole law of Israel is called the Law of Moses. Meanwhile, Elijah was a great prophet, the outstanding representative of all the prophets. He was taken up to Heaven by God directly with a chariot of fire and horses of fire, without having experienced earthly death (2 Kings 2:11). And even, Jesus has been erroneously assumed to be Elijah (Matthew 16:14). Moses and Elijah have represented the great traditions of the Israelite Law and Prophets and all the Law and Prophets directed to the Messiah. Therefore, that Moses and Elijah appeared at the same time, talking to Jesus, was a strong evidence that Jesus was the Messiah, the Son of Eternal God.

If the above mentioned two points are indirect evidences for the special identity of Jesus, then the voice coming above the cloud—the voice of God the Father definitely made it very clear: "This is my Son, the beloved; Listen to Him" (Verse 5). This not only indicated Jesus' identity, but also made a request to his followers— "Listen to Him".

Through this particular event, Jesus has prepared his three special apostles in an extraordinary way and made them believe in whom He was without any doubts. And then they would listen to his teaching more carefully and follow him more closely. More importantly, they could and would lead and influence other disciples and us in being better followers of Christ. By listening to and reflecting on today's Gospel, may we deepen our faith in Jesus—the Son of God, putting more emphasis on his teaching and practicing his teaching in our everyday living harder.

SAFEGUARDING Understanding Blue Card Requirements within Parishes.

Volunteers engaging with Children as part of their ministry are required by legislation to hold a valid Blue Card. There are lots of questions around Blue Card requirements, so we have tried to address a number of these here. If you have any additional questions about Blue Cards as a volunteer, please contact the Archdiocesan Safeguarding Officer, Troy Tornabenetornabenet@bne.catholic.net.au or 3324 3752.

> Due to the complexity, all new volunteer engagement is to be managed through the Parish Office and not through individual ministries. All forms are to be collected from the Parish Office.

Blue Cards - Protection of Children/Minors is the Key prevention and monitoring system of people working with children in QLD.

Volunteering with children requires a valid Blue Card - this includes, but not limited to Children's Liturgy of the Word, Sacramental Program, Altar Server training, Sacristans, Youth Group Coordinators, Choir leaders etc. Those in ministry involved in policy and practice decision making in the Parish, such as Pastoral and Finance Council members will also require Blue Cards.

Volunteers are to **ONLY** use Archdiocesan provided Blue Card forms. (Parish Office) Blue cards from another organisation, needs to be linked to the parish. (Parish Office)

Teachers (Registered)/Police under the legislation, are required to apply for an Exemption card to engage in a Ministry involving children
