### Why Did You Doubt?

Undoubtedly, Peter was a person who had strong faith and dared to take actions. Many times, we find it difficult to rely on Jesus completely. Although we have accepted and believed Jesus fully in our heads, when facing a concrete dangerous situation, we don't have the great faith and courage that Peter had, jumping out of the boat, running towards Jesus. We couldn't do this nor did the other apostles. However, there was still some space for Peter to improve. To us, Peter's faith was already strong but Jesus said that he was a man of little faith. To us, Peter was already very courageous but he still took fright.

Now let us have a look at what was wrong with Peter. He got out of the boat and started walking towards Jesus across the water. Just at this moment, he felt the force of the wind and took fright. Actually within such a short while, his focus had been transferred from Jesus to the wind. In the beginning, all his focus was on Jesus. Otherwise he would not ask Jesus to let him go to Him across the water. When he made this request, he hadn't thought of the dangers that the water and the wind could bring to him at all. All he wanted was to go to Jesus and to be with Him. When he suddenly felt the force of the wind, he came to realize the dangers of life. Then he was frightened. At this time, his focus was no longer on Jesus. He had forgotten what he had wanted one moment ago, being with Jesus. Now his focus was on his own safety and what he wanted was his own security. And then, he feared, he doubted and he began to sink.

What we can learn from this is that we should place our focus on Jesus at all times on our faith journey. Being with Jesus and living out His teaching is the goal of our whole life. If we move our focus away from Jesus and place it on anything else, it would be easy for us to be afraid when confronting dangers. Then we will doubt, we will make wrong choices, and our faith and life will begin to sink.

Either Church communities or us as individuals, the mistake that we easily make is to place our reputation and wealth beyond anything else, even beyond the practice of Jesus' teaching. When we worry about the damage of our reputation and the loss of our wealth excessively, our focus would not be on Jesus anymore and Jesus' teaching would not be our highest principles of life. At that time, we would certainly become fearful of something and doubt what we be believe. That would be the time when our faithful life starts to sink.

Fortunately, when Peter had realized of his danger, he subconsciously thought of Jesus, crying, "Lord! Save me." His focus was back on Jesus again. Immediately he became absolutely safe. Therefore, for either our Church communities or us as individuals, when we are in dangerous situations or when we are afraid of anything, we hope that we can at least subconsciously think of Jesus and cry to Him for help, placing our focus on Him again. Perhaps, He would say to us, "Man of little faith! Why did you doubt?" And we know, no matter how strong the force of the wind would be, how dangerous the situation could become, if we turn to Jesus and rely on Him, He would change danger into safety and we would be saved.
