The celebrations of Holy Week and our Lord's Resurrection

This weekend, we are celebrating Palm Sunday, commemorating our Lord's glorious entry into Jerusalem. This special event marked the commencement of the most important period for Jesus Himself and for the salvation of humankind. After His entry into Jerusalem, Jesus experienced His Trial, Passion, Death and Resurrection. Then, Jesus completed what He could do for human salvation. After this, blessedly, the door leading to God's kingdom has remained open for us to enter if we choose. That's why all the celebrations in this week are so important to Christians.

In our Parish, there are no special liturgical celebrations from Holy Monday to the evening of Holy Thursday. However, it is still a very important time for us to decorate our church, organize liturgical ministers and to prepare liturgical items. Most importantly it is a time to prepare ourselves within. It is a time to meditate on and familiarize ourselves with the liturgies for the rest of the week.

In the evening of Maundy Thursday, it will be the celebration of the Lord's Supper. In this celebration, we remember the institution of two sacraments: Eucharist and priesthood. In His last supper with His Apostles, Jesus instituted the Eucharist by inviting them to eat His flesh under the form of bread and to drink His blood under the form of wine. Also, He commanded His apostles to "do this as a memorial of me." Obviously, Jesus wished this memorial to continue, which required people to succeed the Apostles. Therefore, the sacrament of priesthood was instituted at the same occasion. Very importantly, Jesus washed the feet of His disciples and commanded them to do the same to one another. As the Eucharist is a sacrament of love, through receiving this sacrament, the love in us will be strengthened and then we can serve each other better in love.

On Good Friday, there is no Mass. We will have the Stations of the Cross in the morning. However, the most important liturgy is the commemoration of the Lord's Passion at 3pm. During this liturgy, we focus on the suffering and death of Jesus. We reflect on how much Jesus has done for us and how great is His love for us. If Jesus has sacrificed His life for our salvation, and not for His salvation, then what have we done for our own salvation?

On Holy Saturday evening, we are celebrating our Lord's Resurrection. This Mass marks the most important liturgical celebration throughout the whole year. If you are only able to attend one Mass throughout the whole year, this is the one. The resurrection of Jesus means everything to Christians. As St Paul said, "If Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain." (1 Corinthians, 15:14). Because Jesus' Resurrection represents new life and Baptism means new life in Christ, so this evening is the most recommended time for the reception of Baptism. In our parish, Amanda and Rashelle, as adults, are receiving all three sacraments of initiation, Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at our Easter Vigil Mass. Please pray for them.

My dear friends, in this week, please reduce your social life or other aspects of life to a minimum and make the most of the celebrations of Holy Week and our Lord's Resurrection for your spiritual growth.
