From the Pastor's Desk

Luke 12:49-53: Jesus' Gospel Demands That We Proclaim It with Our Life

The Word for this weekend is not an easy and pleasing one to listen to. Today's first reading and the gospel have parallels in many ways. The mission of the prophet Jeremiah turns to be life threatening for him because his hearers find it hard to follow what it demands. So they want to do away with the prophet. Jeremiah found himself compelled to preach a doubly unwelcome message. He criticized both the political and religious views of the royal establishment and as a result, he was confronted by powerful enemies. The gospel text is an exceptionally anguished cry of distress from the heart of Jesus. The whole passage has a prophetic tone to it. To stand up for the truth and justice necessarily entails that one must be willing to undergo every kind of trial and tribulation. God's word/message is loudly spoken by Jeremiah and God's commands were fearlessly carried out. And the poor prophet found himself in a cistern from which there seemed no escape. Jesus life also faces a similar outcome.

Jeremiah and Jesus were willing to undergo any kind of trial not only because they were convinced of God's word of truth, not only because it was a motivation that came from within their hearts, but because they were confident that God who had ordained them to speak the word would be with them every step of the way. The Rio Olympic Games progress and we are really surprised by the motivation and dedication each athlete takes to bring out the best in the field. When it is done with the heart and passion on, that makes it not a trial but a great task. This can be told about the word and its preaching. When we do it with passion and reason, it compels us to live it and then proclaim it. We too confront injustice, lifethreatening wicked deeds by some groups or individuals in the form of terrorism, discrimination of people, especially the poor who are facing all kinds of hardships for survival, and even forced to leave their own land and people. When someone takes a stand with and supports the rights of these people, may face persecution, betrayal, and other kind of suffering for their convictions. Pope Francis is fearlessly speaking against all kinds of persecutions and he too is criticized by some. Hopefully he will be defended by God. We are the mission sharers of the Word today, and we are asked to be people defending the message of truth, justice, mercy and joy. Catholic Mission Sunday reminds us of this task witnessing Jesus and his message in today's world, and to defend the right of the poor in the world. It is the word that demands equality for all sections of society and for women and men alike. Will we as disciples of Jesus be prepared to commit ourselves to the mission of God?
