Second Sunday in Ordinary time Year A

15th January 2017

Pastor's Note: Second Sunday in Ordinary Time: John 29-34. We Have a Mission and a Role in its Fulfillment

The Lectionary remains with the Christmas theme for one more week. It is as if the church is still enjoying Christmas and is reluctant to move on to Ordinary Time and the mission of Jesus. We are free to identify with either: to celebrate times when some John the Baptist (a person, a word, or an event) invites us to take a fresh look at Jesus coming towards us; to celebrate our mission as parents, teachers, friends, community leaders, spiritual guides to proclaim to the world - and often to ourselves - that those in our care are sacred and respect them and love them as God has shown His love towards us. John points out two aspects of Jesus: He is the lamb of God that takes away the sins of the world. We say these same words at every Holy Mass and we have become so accustomed to them that they no longer strike us. So we can take the opportunity of this Sunday's Gospel to let them come alive for us. Secondly the words help us to appreciate those who have been for us 'lambs of God' who took away the sin of our community, people who have touched our lives, and help us to understand in life-situations the words.

The second part of the saying, he takes away the sins of the world, states the purpose of the first, so we start with it. It clearly tells us that Jesus is an activist; he does not merely oppose sin in theory, he takes it away. He does not accept sin as inevitable (as most of us see it), but he wages war against it. As individuals and as a church, we have tended to water down the aspect of Jesus' (and our) mission. We resign ourselves to accepting evil on the ground that it is inevitable, and in any case, we are powerless to do anything about it; we say to ourselves (and to others) that this is how life is and we must conform with it. We spiritualise sin, saving things like 'we must hate sin but love the sinner', we pray for sinners and their conversion, and we all are sinners in our own way, etc. These are important and very Christian sentiments, but in practice they are used all too often to cover up the fact that we are not taking away some evil in the community. Of course, we celebrate the times and seasons when some John the Baptist (a person, an event, a scripture passage) challenged us to look again at Jesus' taking away the sin of the world. See, Jesus has a distinctive way of taking away sin. He does it by being a lamb of God. It means an activist against evil in the community, in the world. Fr Jacob Chacko, MCBS

Tuesday 17th January is the feast day of St Anthony

Born in 251 in upper Egypt. Died in 356. At an early age he gave away his possessions and sought the austere life and solitude in the desert. Yet he remained involved in the theological controversies of his day, defending the divinity of Christ. He attracted disciples who formed communities of hermits. The account of his life by Saint Athanasius (2 May) was extremely influential in the development and spread of monasticism. Remembered as the father of monasticism.

Saturday 21st January is the feast day of St Agnes

Died at Rome, perhaps in the early fourth century. One of the most widely venerated of the Roman martyrs. According to early accounts, she gave her life to preserve her virginity consecrated to Christ. Remembered in Eucharistic Prayer I (The Roman Canon).
