Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord 16th April 2017

(Easter Sunday Readings: Acts 10:34, 36-43 Colossians 3:1-4 John 20:1-9)

Do not be afraid

When I first learned some basic reading skills, my parents started getting me some children's catechetical books. They encouraged, to be exact, forced, me to read them. Now I can't recall the contents of all the books but one. That book has been deeply rooted in my mind and will never go away. In a very colourful way, that book described the situation of hell. There were a lot of very vivid illustrations of demons, sinners and fires in the book. They were so terrifying. Even now, when some of the illustrations occasionally come back to my mind, I still feel scared.

When I grew a bit older, my parents required me to learn Catechism systematically for first Communion and Reconciliation. The deepest impression it made on me is that people will be punished severely and sent to hell by God if they, carelessly, drift away a second from religious responsibilities. And religious responsibilities are usually understood as observing the law strictly but outwardly, such as fasting and abstinence. Living a faithful life is just like treading on thin ice.

Is our faithful life really so terrifying? Is God really so harsh? I kept asking these questions over and over again until I got the chance to read today's Gospel (Matthew 28:1-10, Gospel reading for Easter Vigil Liturgy). In the Gospel, the phrase, "Do not be afraid", is mentioned twice. Firstly, the angel told the women that Jesus had risen. And the angel said, "there is no need for you to be afraid." Then they became the messengers of the Good News and ran to tell the disciples. They met the resurrected Lord on their way and for the second time, they were told, "Do not be afraid", this time, by the Lord.

Actually, there is no need for us to be afraid, either. Jesus loves us so much that He has died for us, then how could he be willing to make our faithful life so hard? He has conquered death. Then what else can't He conquer? Jesus is our Lord, then what do we have to be afraid of? The two women had such great love for Jesus that, though Jesus had died, it was still dark, and they were not sure if there was a future for them, they went to see Jesus at His grave. If we are like them in loving God and neighbours, we will see angels. After they heard the news of Jesus' Resurrection, they immediately left and ran to share this with others. If we are like them in sharing, we will meet the Resurrected Lord.

Dear friends, let us remember this message this Easter: as long as we follow the Lord, keep love in our hearts and try to practice that love, our faithful life will not be terrifying at all. Also, God is not as severe and harsh as some understood. He is as amiable and lovely as our parents, actually, much better than our parents. So, let us "do not be afraid" and rejoice always since faith is not a burden but a joy.

Social Justice News: This month of April we commemorate the great social justice encyclical, Pacem in Terris. It is one of the great Catholic social justice encyclicals and was promulgated by Pope John XXIII on 11th April, 1963, just two months



before his death. The encyclical was written against the background of the Cold War and the nuclear arms race. In 2013, Pope Francis spoke of this writing as remaining "extremely contemporary". In our world today, we still very much need this guide to peacebuilding. It was noteworthy for being the first encyclical to be addressed, not just to Catholics, but to "all men of good will". It reminds us that the basis of peace-making exists in our "divine origin" and thus everyone, from individuals and families to society and States are called to "build peace, on the example of Jesus Christ... by promoting and practicing justice with truth and love... (and) contributing...to integral human development" through solidarity.

Pacem in Terris reminds us that there can be no real peace and harmony unless we work for a more just and jointly supportive society.
