(Readings: Isaiah 25:6-10 Philippians 4:12-14, 19-20 Matthew 22:1-14)

Invite everyone you can find to the wedding

In today's gospel, Jesus tells us a very instructive parable. A king had invited many people to the wedding of his son, but, when the wedding was ready, all those who had been invited refused to attend it with different excuses. Even worse, they killed the messengers. The king was so angry that he not only punished them but also destroyed their cities.

In this parable, these people represent the Israelites, who were God's chosen people and had been invited by God to attend the banquet of the kingdom of heaven. In order to make them eligible, God gave them the Law and sent many prophets to teach and guide them. The people were to learn about love, mercy and compassion, by which, a good path could be prepared, for the saviour to be born and then the salvation of the whole of mankind would be possible. Of course, if they followed the teaching of the prophets and observed God's law. they would have more chances to enter the kingdom of God than others. But, unfortunately, they didn't get the spirit of the Law and only observed it externally. Meanwhile, they didn't have love and mercy in their hearts, not only neglecting the wellbeing of the widows and orphans, but also oppressing them. Apart from this, they didn't worship God from the bottom of their hearts. When they prayed, they didn't try to please God but just wanted to catch the attention of and get praise from people around them. Obviously, they were getting further and further from the banquet of heaven. That is why Jesus said that they were those who had received the invitation but excused themselves from attending the banquet.

At last, the king sent the messengers out, asking them to invite everyone they could find to the wedding. So, anyone who they would happen to meet would be invited, no matter who they were. By which, Jesus teaches us that salvation is universal. No difference between nations, languages or skins, anyone who is able to love and be loved, who has mercy and compassion in their hearts, could be saved. And all of us have been created in the likeness of God, who is the source of love, mercy and compassion, therefore, each of us has already had the seeds of all these good virtues in our hearts. We just need to dig them out, water them and make them grow, by which, we are moving forward on the journey to the wedding.

However, we can learn from today's gospel that there is one condition for us to attend the wedding, which is, we have to wear a wedding garment. Without the garment, we will be driven out of the wedding hall. Here, the wedding garment points to the good Christian life that we should have as Christians. In summary, the good Christian life is the process of the practice of Jesus' teaching, loving God and neighbours. This is the only one condition for the admission to the wedding.

Dear friends, what we need to remember today is that we have been invited to the wedding via baptism, like the Israelites. But if we don't practice our faith in everyday life, if our hearts are not full of love, mercy and compassion, then we will become those who have been invited to, but will refuse to attend, the wedding, or those who are already in the wedding hall but will be driven out for not wearing the wedding garment.

2017 Social Justice Sunday: We are celebrating Social Justice Sunday. The Catholic Bishops have published a statement: "Everyone's Business: Developing an inclusive, sustainable economy." The Statement recognizes the great benefits of economic growth Australia has achieved over recent decades. However, not all Australians have shared in this national prosperity. Nearly 3 000 000 Australians live in poverty. Included in this number are 730 000 children. Those excluded are the lowest paid workers, the unemployed, the homeless, and the First people of this Land. The statement echoes the words of Pope Francis for all of us to become an instrument of God for the liberation and promotion of the poor, vulnerable and excluded and to create an economy that is inclusive and founded on true solidarity with the most needy. The Statement challenges us to ponder, how we as a parish or as individuals, will respond to become an instrument of positive change, of justice, compassion and mercy. 
