From the Pastor's Desk

Luke 16:1-13: Be Focused in Life and Seek God's Kingdom First

The story is told of a man who was caught stealing. He was taken to the king who ordered him to be hanged. On his way to the gallows he said to the governor that he knew a great secret and it would be a pity to allow it to die with him. He would disclose it only to the king, and hence he was taken back to the king. To the king he said that he got a secret from his ancestors that if he puts a seed of a mango into the ground, he would make it grow and bear fruit overnight. He was taken to the field and there he dug a hole and then said, 'This seed to grow overnight and bear fruit, it should be put into the soil by a man who has never stolen or taken anything that did not belong to him. The man must be a totally honest person. I am a thief and I can't do that. So one of you shall do that'. Every one withdrew including the king, because all of them had some past story of stealing or taking others' things. Finally the thief had a great look at all those people and had big smile on his face.

Today's gospel story too is intriguing in its narration and in its action. The parable of the dishonest steward and the saying about wealth are the content of the story. Jesus is not afraid of featuring controversial characters in his stories. A wealthy man's manager has proved unworthy in his stewardship and he has not exercised his office with integrity, and his master would be sacking him soon. So he is making clever deals with his master's business associates. There is of course, the possibility that the story could be interpreted to mean that dishonesty or thievery is all right. But the key is this: When faced with death, the man uses all his ingenuity, creativity, and inventiveness to save his life. He uses all his skills to get out of an extremely hard situation. Jesus very well focuses on the prompt and speedy action that the steward takes. He takes control of a terrible situation that is life-threatening to him. And, more importantly the focus of Jesus in the parable is on the contrast between the steps that the wicked steward takes for things that are temporary and earthly and the lethargy that is shown by most when it comes to things that eternal. So Jesus is telling us seek first the kingdom of God and all other things will be given to us when we value the eternal truths. Have a heart and mind of God and believe what is revealed to us in Christ Jesus.

Child Protection Sunday: The images of child sexual abuse have continued to affect our entire community and diminish the trust some have placed in our Church. That trust has been further eroded when the institution has failed to appropriately respond to the victim's needs. One such example can be seen in Pope Francis' apostolic exhortation Amoris Laetitia, in which families and consequently communities are encouraged through love, strengthened by the virtues of generosity, commitment, fidelity and patience to become stronger more capable and more resilient. Stronger families and Church communities can then help to keep our children safe. As the Royal Commission begins to finalise hearings and close registration for private sessions, Child Protection Week, and in particular Child Protection Sunday provides a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the steps we have taken to make children safer in our communities; at home, in our churches, schools and Catholic agencies.

Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults Policy: The Archdiocese of Brisbane holds that children and vulnerable adults are a gift from God with an intrinsic right to dignity of life, respect and security from physical and emotional harm. They are to be treasured, nurtured and protected from any harm.


