# 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A 20th August 2017

(Readings: Isaiah 56:1, 6-7 Romans 11:13-15, 29-32 Matthew 15:21-28)

## Welcome the Stranger

This week we celebrate Migrant and Refugee Week 2017 in our parish when we recall the role of migration in our own land be it Aboriginal migration over 60,000 years ago or European migration which commenced in 1788.

In our parish we have people from many different countries of origin, some who have fled poverty, some who have fled violence and some who have simply sought a better place to raise their families. Wherever we have come from, we who were once 'strangers' rejoice in being part of this community.

Jesus identifies Himself as a stranger to be welcomed (Matthew 25:35). The Catholic Church teaches that Christ has in some way united himself to every person, whether or not one is aware of this.

Christ will consider done to himself the kind of treatment that is reserved to any human person, in particular, to the least among them, the stranger. While the gospel compels us to welcome strangers it also presents the opportunity to practice the commandment to love God "with all your heart, all your soul, all your mind and all your strength" and to love the other "as you love yourself" Mark 12:29-31.

Pope John Paul II invited us to an ever deeper awareness of the mission of the Catholic Church: "to see Christ in every brother and sister in need, to proclaim and defend the dignity of every migrant, every displaced person and every refugee. In this way, assistance given will not be considered an alms from the goodness of our heart, but an act of justice due to them".

"I was a stranger and you welcomed me" (Matthew 25:35)

From the Social Justice Group: Every year in August Catholics around Australia celebrate Migrant and Refugee Sunday. It is a celebration of the dignity of people who are refugees and migrants and the contribution they have made to life in Australia. Most Australians have immigrant ancestors who have come to this Great Southern Land in search for better opportunities for themselves and their families and have reaped rich rewards. This trend is continuing today when desperate people, fleeing violence and extreme poverty in their homelands knock on our door asking us to let them in.

For the 103 World Day of Migrants and Refugees Pope Francis has chosen the theme: "Child Migrants, the Vulnerable and the Voiceless". The beautiful poster for 2017 portrays Jesus surrounded by two children, one in total distress and the other peacefully attending to writing. Check out the poster on the banner, in front of the altar.

At present 535 million children live in countries affected by conflict and disaster, deprived of food, shelter, health care and education. When migrant and refugee children come to Australia, attention needs to be paid to assisting parents. By helping families, children will have the best opportunities of succeeding in their new home. Education is vital in assisting child migrants and parents. Many catholic parishes and schools have embraced refugee children. Many libraries provide homework help every afternoon during school time.

On this Sunday let us celebrate our rich cultural mix. Let us also resolve to be inclusive and welcoming and to create a harmonious and multicultural nation that offers freedom, peace, democracy, acceptance and opportunity for all.
