From the Pastor's Desk

Luke 13:22-30. Living Fully the Gift of Life

The late Anthony de Mello, a great story teller, in one of his seminars, made a very telling remark "It is the very people who do not know what to do with this life who are concerned about the next". Concerns, deep thoughts and even worries about the next life or what will happen after death are issues that so many are anxious about. In many cases, this leads to not being able to live fully the present life which has so much to offer. Few years ago I was asked to visit with a young woman in a hospital who was diagnosed with advanced cancer. She had been married to a very successful young man and they had three beautiful young children - two boys and a girl. The man was totally upset when he was told that his wife has got only few more months to live as per medical evaluation. When I was with the patient, I never knew how I could console her. No words could avail, I thought. But the woman really surprised me. She told me that God had given her a great life; a very caring man she got as her husband; and they were gifted with three great kids. She said, "Yesterday I had a talk with my husband. I told him that after my death, shall you marry again, for you alone cannot take care and bring up our children. Never ever give a chance for our children to feel that they are not loved. Also, share with them that I always wanted to be with them, but life takes turns and they too have to realize it slowly ... I am going to my God and I will be a mediator and He will take care of you very well". A woman of great faith who could trust in God in spite of what happens, I said to myself while I was leaving from the hospital.

The present is the gift of God, and the way we respond in love and faith will determine our future. The here and now are the gift of life and the given-ness of life is to be appreciated to its full. Now is the time for making the best of the given-ness of life with all its beauty and of course its challenges and responsibilities. And now is the time to hope for what is yet to come and be dreaming of its possibilities and many ways to live its best for ourselves and for others. And this attempt to realize its greatness is the striving to enter by the narrow door. Not simply spending it lavishly and luxuriously with the extravaganzas, but to will it and to make it meaningful. Go beyond the obligations of a Christian, but rather celebrate it as a gift, the greatest gift you could get, and God could give you as well. Jesus' way of living his life is a model for us in the way he listened to God, giving his life fully for ransom for many. He told us, "I have come that you may have life and have it in abundance" (John 10:10). Fr Jacob Chacko, MCBS


