Thomas ... was not with them when Jesus came

Human beings are herd animals by nature. Community is very important to everyone. People have the need of and yearning for community. For example, we always want to be with parents when are babies or young children. When we grow up, we long to have our own families. After beginning to work, we hope to form good teams with our colleagues. Also, many would like to take part in good social or religious communities, in which they gain and offer support and help from and for other members. Mind you, when you are in a good community, you will be much healthier spiritually as well as physically. On the contrary, if you lose or leave your community, you will feel lonely and isolated. With time passing by, this will lead to weakness, mental fatique and bad health.

It is true for general people as well as for religious believers. Todav's first reading describes the situation of the very early Church community. They met regularly, celebrating liturgies together, praying with one heart and mind, and listening to the teaching of the apostles. They had the same purpose of life and supported one another in spirit. Not only this, they also, on property level, shared whatever they had with one another. It was a big spiritual family in which all members shared the happiness with one another and faced the difficulties together. This was definitely an ideal community that everyone else wants to be in. Whoever you are, if you are in it, you will just feel happy and secure.

It would be a huge loss for a believer to not have or to have left a good faith community. In today's Gospel, Thomas was such an example. After Jesus' Resurrection, the apostles regained the strength and cohesive force. They met from time to time, having reorganized the community. Obviously, Thomas was not with them always. That is why he missed the chance to meet the Resurrected Lord for the first time. For Thomas, it was a big miss. Fortunately, he hadn't cut himself off from the community totally. When Jesus came to meet the apostles for the second time, he met the Resurrected Lord.

Therefore, please do not think that your local Church community may or may not be needed. If you are not fully involved in your local Church community or have left it, you would possibly be like Thomas, losing the chance to meet the Resurrected Lord or delaying it. On the contrary, if you are fully integrated into the local Church community, trying your best to build it up to the full, just like the Church community in today's first reading, you will feel joyful and satisfied, peaceful and happy living in it.

Dear friends, our Church community is our spiritual home, namely, a community of life to each of us. It is the responsibility of each of us to build it up and the way to do so is to do volunteer jobs as many as possible, to attend its activities as often as possible, to work on its development hard, and to care about its members. When we do this well, the other members of the community, of course, will benefit from it greatly but the most benefactive people will be ourselves.
