From the Pastor's Desk

Luke 11:1-13. Prayer and transforms a Person's Life.

There is an old story of a monk who was bothered by mice playing around him when he prayed. To prevent it, he got a cat and kept it in the prayer room so the mice would be scared away. But he never explained to his disciples why he had the cat. One day the monk walked down the corridor of the monastery and noticed that each of his disciples had a cat in their prayer room. After seeing the master with a cat in the prayer room, they thought that having a cat was the secret to powerful praying. And this Sunday gospel talks to us about prayer and the need to pray. Prayer has been defined as *talking with God, listening to God, petitioning God, intimate communion and communication with God,* and so on. However a definition that I like best is *Prayer is action*. Be sure, there is no shortcut to improve the depth and quality of prayer.

Luke's version of the Lord's Prayer is shorter than the more familiar one in Matthew's gospel. However, all the essential elements are there. We are asked to address God as 'Father' (Abba) because that word, in normal circumstances, suggests to a child both strength and love. This leads us to the rather astounding conclusion that God's supreme power is made available to us through his love. We are then told to pray for the coming of the kingdom - the fulfillment of God's loving plan for us - which comes only at the end of time. In the meantime we will need daily spiritual nourishment so that we may be strong enough and free enough to forgive and be merciful to others as we wait in faith and love the final challenge at the moment of death. Jesus then makes all this even more explicit by offering us examples of the power of prayer, especially when it is fervent and persistent. Praying for the coming of the kingdom does not mean asking God to come and 'shape up' all those other folks who are not as upright as we are. Rather, it means that we trust God so much that we want his dream for us to be fulfilled. It is therefore the victory of God's love for which we pray ... and that may very well mean forgiveness of our own self-righteousness. We are asked to pray for the daily bread, because we are pilgrims on our journey of life. Mostly we need the nourishment/food of courage and hope, lest we succumb to cynicism and despair. Then we ask our Heavenly Father to lift from our shoulders the burden of sinfulness and guilt so that we may make this journey with wings on our feet. This petition is followed by a solemn pledge to turn our sense of confidence and joy into forgiveness for all our fellow travellers. To be a true contemplative, said St Theresa of Avila, you must simply say the Lord's Prayer ... but you must say it very, very slowly! In other words, this prayer is an experience of faith and hope for us and for the world. Remember that the World Youth day (WYD) is on July 25-31 in Poland, Krakow, and Pope Francis will be present from 28th onward to help millions of youth to experience the love and mercy of God and thus to transform their lives for God.
