Praying the Stations of the Cross

Praying the Stations of the Cross has been an integral part of the devotional life of Catholics for centuries. The roots of the devotion can be found among the early Christian practices. We know that the last few days in the life of Jesus Christ, in which He suffered, died and rose, have been a special source of devotion. And pilgrimages to the Holy Places connected with these last days began in the early centuries, but not all the faithful could make a trip to the Holy Land. People needed to find some other way to commemorate and spiritually share what Jesus had experienced in His last period of earthly life. It's believed that five stations already appeared in the fifth century. However, the now familiar number of 14 first appeared in the 16th century. In 1991, Pope Saint John Paul II reshaped the stations of the Cross to include only those stations found in the Gospels.

In today's Church, the devotion is still a very common practice, particularly during the period of Lent, because it is very important and helpful in deepening our relationship with the Lord. When we pray the Stations of the Cross, we are being led to an experience of the deep love of God revealed through the suffering and death of the Lord. It also can provide an opportunity for reflection on how God's love is revealed through our experiences of loss, betrayal, and death. Praying these stations, whether in private or as a part of public prayer, should help a person draw closer to Jesus Christ.

In our Parish of St Peter's, we encourage every parishioner to join us in praying the Stations of the Cross every Friday evening at 7:30pm during Lent. It is our hope that as you do this, you will experience the same certitude of faith in the love that God has for you as Jesus did when he accepted His cross, and that you will be rewarded with a share in His resurrection. Please believe that it is a great way for us to prepare ourselves well for the celebrations of Easter.

Here I would like to invite our parishioners to be active in leading this important devotion. It will be a good opportunity to experience and taste deeper and better what Jesus has endured in the last stage of His earthly life by not only attending it but leading it. You don't have to do a lot of preparations. We have some books of the Stations of the Cross kept in the sacristy. You just need to choose one of them and then start leading. Nice and simple! Some experienced parishioners and myself will be there helping you. Hope to see all of you on Friday evenings in Lent. May God bless you all.

Planned Giving Report - In July last year it became apparent that our parish income was slowly in decline and was in danger of not keeping pace with the rising costs associated with the running of a parish committed to meeting the spiritual and temporal needs of a large community. The departure from our parish of several families in recent times had prompted us to review our regular gifting methods to ensure that the parish is best equipped to meet current and future financial commitments.

The Parish Planned Giving Program had not been reviewed for some years. Consequently, a Planned Giving Gifting week-end was conducted at all masses in November last year at which some detail of the parish financial position was presented to parishioners. Approximately 50 gifting cards were returned indicating either a new member of the Planned Giving Program or an adjustment to the amount of gift from a previous commitment. The positive response has enabled a new planned giving program that is regularly reviewed and supported by parishioners, ensuring the parish is best placed to meet current financial obligations and provide for those areas of parish ministry which are in most need.

The total picture of the program is not yet finalised as **there are still new gifting cards being returned each week**. It is clear, however, that parishioners are moving from envelopes to electronic gifting with about 60 contributors now using electronic gifting in some form. The amount being received in this form has almost doubled. Electronic gifting methods are encouraged as a means to meet personal financial management arrangements and to assist with the management of income at Parish level. The provision of the traditional envelopes will continue, and several new contributors have entered the program using the envelope method with the number of envelopes being distributed remaining static.

We can advise that the various methods of gifting have been accepted by parishioners who have embraced the electronic gifting through Direct Debit, Direct Bank Transfer or Credit Card. All these methods of gifting are outlined in the weekly newsletter together with information explaining how you can identify the method that best suits your personal situation. It is not too late to be a member of the Planned Giving Program. Personal information relating to your gift and credit card are treated in strictest confidence. **Gifting information envelopes containing the yellow commitment card are available near the main doors of the church.**

Since the establishment of St Peters Parish in 1974 we have experienced wonderful support from our parishioners across a range of endeavours to enable us to fulfil our mission as a Catholic Community. It is important that we acknowledge this support and thank all parishioners who have been supporting the parish financially over these years and to acknowledge the new parishioners who have committed financially to our planned giving program.





