You are worth more than hundreds of sparrows

The world population is already over 7 billion, among which, the existence of individuals seems insignificant and it could be ignored completely. With or without any individual one of us, the world would be the same, with the sun still rising in the east and setting in the west, with tide still ebbing and rising at the same time. Sometimes, we feel that nobody really cares about our existence but our families and friends. Under some particular circumstances, even our families and friends could abandon us, too.

However, there is one who is much richer, more important and famous than anyone in the world, and He cares about us at all times, each one of us. Whether we are rich and important or poor and nobody, we are cared about by Him. Not only us, He even sees sparrows that are not worth much in our eyes, as treasures. He cares not only about our lives, but also every hair on our heads that has been counted by Him. He is our God. And He is the only one who will never leave us orphaned and alone.

By knowing this, many things can become much easier. Firstly, we won't self-disvalue easily. When we are frustrated by life failures, we could be looked down upon by others and/or cornered to some cold and lonely place. Then we could feel hopeless, useless and valueless. But if we think of how much our God cares about us, we will know that even if everyone thinks we are losers, looks down on us, and says that we are incapable of anything, God wouldn't and He will still love us. We are still valuable in His eyes. We know that not even one sparrow will fall to the ground without our God knowing and we are worth more than hundreds of sparrows.

Secondly, we don't need to worry about our security. It is impossible for us to avoid all dangerous situations. In such situations, we always feel powerless and helpless. However, every time when we think of our God who cares about us unconditionally, we will feel relieved because we know God will never leave us alone. God wouldn't even allow a sparrow to lose its life for no reason, let alone human beings created in His own image. When we realise this, we will calm down and face courageously whatever we have to, singing and praising God.

Lastly, we will never walk away from God. What people usually seek are wealth, fame and power. But no morning sun lasts a whole day. At a time, we can be rich, famous and powerful but we can't guarantee that for our whole life. Wealth, fame and power are always to flow from one to another. So, we can't rely on them and the so-called friends won by them. The truly reliable one is God since He is the one who has even counted our hair. After we have realized all of these, will we leave God? No, never ever.

Dear friends, our lasting values reside in God. Our real security stays in God. Our eternal happiness is in God. It is only God who will not allow a sparrow to fall to the ground for no reason, and in His eyes, we are worth more than hundreds of sparrows.
