# 25th September 2016

From the Pastor's Desk

Luke 16:19-31. The Dives and Lazarus.

Both texts from the prophet Amos and the Gospel of Luke of this weekend seem to indicate that riches are bad, or that luxury is to be shunned, and try to be away from it for your spiritual life. A deeper reading, however, indicates that the core question of these texts is "Am I my brother/sister's keeper? (Gen 4:9). Riches and luxury are a problem when they are gained at the expense of others' misery. They are a problem when they deaden the mind and the senses to responsibility. They are a problem when they become ends in themselves or when those who possess them become insensitive and unfeeling to the needs of others around hem. The Gospel parable has often been titled as the parable of Dives and Lazarus. The rich man is not named. The Latin word 'dives' simply means rich The parable has three parts: In the first, the focus is on rich man's opulence and wealth; the story begins by describing the rich man and his dress and food. the second part, the focus is on the rich man's death and burial. The longest of the narrative forms the third part, and it is a dialogue. It is between the rich man and Abraham, and this forms the climax of the story, the 'purple and fine linen' may signify his love for luxury and his indulging in it. In his earthly life Lazarus lay outside the rich man's house; after death he is welcomed into Abraham's embrace. In life the rich man dwells in his own luxury house with all sorts of enjoyments; in death he is a cast away in to Hades where the wicked are punished for ever.

The rich man probably thought he was a good fellow - he meant no harm to any one, and let Lazarus stay at his gate; perhaps he might have many friends and they would have spoken well of him at his funeral. He is criticized because he was insensitive to the pain and sufferings of those so close to him. He had, as many of us would have, a blind spot - his was a sin of omission. There are many kinds of poverty, even in our homes, that we don't notice. We can live a marriage like the rich man, getting our own way, driving ahead, not noticing what I am doing to those I live with, not learning what change might be required of me. We could be arrogant to others, not being sensitive to their needs. Be a good friend, a good spouse, a sensible and loving parent, dutiful children to elderly parents and so on are the ways to be my brother/sister's keeper and that is the challenge of the Gospel for us today. The cost of being human is to notice Lazarus at the gate, and respond to him as a brother is the key theme of the parable.

Every Volunteer will also be given copies of the various Archdiocesan Policies. Please read and keep all the policy documents. Volunteers who work with children still have to get a Blue Card. Volunteers who visit vulnerable adults in their homes or Nursing homes and volunteers who work in the finance area of the Parish will need to consent to a Police Check.
