Pastor's Note: "The works of God might be displayed in him"

Life is not a bed of roses and is always full of ups and downs. Whoever you are, it is impossible to have a smooth life at all times. Most people won't challenge this, however, different people always have different views on how to understand or explain the hardship of life.

The Israelites believe in monotheism. They always try to understand the hardship of life in the perspective of faith. To many of them, Yahweh is a God who is very clear and strict on reward and punishment. For people in this world, if they follow His will and observe His law carefully, their lives would be roses all the way. On the contrary, if they ignore God's will and law, focus on seeking fame and accumulating earthly wealth and feel free to commit sins, God would punish them severely. And there are many ways in which God punishes sinners, including physical disability. In one word, all human hardship comes from sin. Influenced by this, when the disciples of Jesus saw the man born blind in today's Gospel, they asked him: "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, for him to have been born blind?" Actually but sadly, that influence still exists in today's Church. Some still hold this view but it is so wrong.

By taking this opportunity, Jesus was trying to change their wrong understanding of human hardship, saying, "Neither he nor his parents sinned. He was born blind so that the works of God might be displayed in him". That is very true. Any human hardship is an opportunity for human beings, an opportunity for them to display God's works.

Let us take physical disability as an example. If one, unfortunately, is disabled, he can still have a positive attitude towards life. With strong faith in God, relying on God's grace and strength, he can live a fully and meaningful life. By his own life, he has displayed how great God's works has been in his life. By his own life, he has proclaimed to all that if we have God, we can conquer any hardship and we have nothing to fear.

God's works not only can be displayed through the life of the disabled, it also can be done through the life of those around them. For those around them, this is an opportunity, too. Similarly, with strong faith in God, relying on God's grace and strength, they can support and care for those disabled. Due to their loving and caring words and actions, those disabled can still have a happy and beautiful life. And then, God's works would have been displayed successfully.

Jesus has utilized the opportunity to the full. He healed the blind man, having displayed God's works, namely, His mercy and love, in him. By this, he educated his disciples, too. If we ourselves or those around us are disabled or suffering other hardship, let us remember Jesus' teaching in today's Gospel, not seeing any human hardship as a punishment from God but an opportunity from God to display God's works. And following Jesus' way, let us take this opportunity and utilize it to the full. That's exactly the right way we glorify God by our lives.

- how to respond to safeguarding issues in the parish

Ongoing Monitoring - Internal and External Review

- Internal reviews/audits will be conducted annually
- Independent, External review of Parishes over a 5 year period commenced in 2016.


