One-day pilgrimage to Sydney

Last Friday, the leaders and teachers of St Peter's School and I, 33 of us altogether, went to Sydney for a one-day pilgrimage. We set out at around 5:30am and came back at about 9:30pm. It was a long day. All of us were very tired but the day was very meaningful and fruitful. Here I would like to share some of my reflections on the journey.

Our first stop was the Sydney Jewish Museum. Firstly, a lady spoke to us, introducing us to the experiences and hardships that the Jewish people endured during the Second World War. The stories were really heartbreaking. Though I had heard many such stories before, I felt shocked, in such a very special place, hearing so many details of the suffering that the Jewish community experienced. Later, another lady shared with us some of her own life stories. Her father was a Jew and died at the concentration camp. She herself witnessed her father being taken away by Nazi soldiers when she was a little girl. She never saw her father again. After that, her family underwent many difficulties, troubles and problems and finally settled in Sydney. Lastly, we had a tour in the museum, seeing a lot of pictures and objects obtained from that era of tragedy. It seemed that we had been back to those days, very touching and moving. Among us, one asked a question: why were the Jews being persecuted so severely? The answer we got was: one of the main reasons was that the Jews had killed Jesus. This made me think: how important seeing things through the right and positive perspective is. It is very easy for people to view things negatively. I couldn't help to ask: why could people have just remembered that Jesus was killed by Jews, but forgotten that Jesus himself was a Jew and it was the God's chosen people who, under God's plans and grace, prepared the environment and made it possible for the saviour to be born? Why don't we thank the Jewish people for our saviour coming from them?

The second stop was Mary Mackillop Place. We had a tour in the museum, learning a lot of her life story. How she, with the encouragement and help from Fr Woods, opened her first school and then dedicated her whole life to education. She endured many hardships, among which her excommunication from the Church was the greatest one, I think. For the foundation of the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart, she went to Rome twice to see the then pope. At the end, we celebrated the liturgy of the Word in the chapel. Of course, we focused on the famous saying by St Mary of the Cross Mackillop, "Never see a need without doing something about it". In my homily, I challenged our teachers: what need have they seen in their work? The one seen through my perspective was: there are many Catholic schools in Australia but many young Catholics, graduated from our schools, don't practice their faith as other Catholics do. Is there something that can or should be done in our Catholic school? What have they seen? What can they do? What have they been doing?

Dear friends, here I would like to remind you, my parishioners: Please view everything from a positive perspective and always challenge yourselves, never see a need without doing something about it. In so doing, I believe our Parish and our School will be more attractive and successful.
