First Sunday of Advent Year A 27th November 2016

Pastor's Note:

Season of Advent: The First Sunday. Matthew 24:37-44: Stay Awake .. For the Son Of Man Is Coming

The first day of the season of Advent begins today. In four weeks' time we will be at the manger and will celebrate the coming of the Son of God among us a our prophet, our priest, and our king. But to know who Jesus is, we must recall the faith of the people who looked out for him, we must look to the writings of the Old Testament to see what they say about the promise of God to visit His people ... and during these four weeks we will read much from the prophet Isaiah; we must recall those who prepared the way for his coming - we recall the work of John the Baptist; we will reflect on how the Christ comes to birth in our world through our faith and discipleship; and we will remember Mary and Joseph whose faith and acceptance of the invitation of God inaugurated the whole Christian era. Let us stop and in silence note that this moment is an important turning point in our life and in the year.

The word Advent of course means coming. So in Advent we celebrate the various comings of Jesus, the Word Incarnate and God on Earth—Emmanuel God with us. We commemorate his coming at Bethlehem some 2000 years ago, his second coming at the end time, and his coming to us in time in our baptism and in the reception of his sacraments, especially the Eucharist. The Church urges us to open our hearts to receive him with faith, hope and love. According to Matthew, in today's Gospel, the coming of Jesus requires of us a decision for him and watchfulness. Any day, any moment could be the final coming of the Lord for you and for me. The Second coming of the Lord will be, unlike the first one, will be sudden and unexpected, like the flood in the time of Noah! Many people ignored the warnings, ridiculed Noah for building a big boat on dry land, far from the sea. How ridiculous! But the flood came and destroyed them, while Noah survived with his family and animals. The future coming of the Lord will slip quietly into the present, like a thief in the night. Everything said in the Gospel about the Second Coming also applies to us. Any day we can meet a sudden death on a highway - and that is the final coming of Jesus as far as we personally are concerned. Be prepared and be ready for him. Be prepared, be watchful!
