# 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Lent - Year C 28<sup>th</sup> February 2016

From the Pastor's Desk

Luke 13:1-9: Questions Without Answers. In William Shakespeare's play Hamlet, there is a scene in which Prince Hamlet says to his friend Horatio: "There are more things in heaven and earth, Horatio, than are dreamt of in your philosophy". Hamlet could well have been talking about God. No matter how much we think we know about God, He will always remain a mystery if not incomprehensible. We will know only so much and no more; there will be more to know of God and the way God encounters us. The First reading today narrates Moses' encounter with God. This encounter is one of both revelation - I am who I am - and mystery if not concealment. Moses would never be, as we are, able to understand or fully comprehend who God really is. God is revealed as one who will remain faithful, even in the face of infidelity, and one who will be eternally present to people who call upon His name.

In the Gospel too Jesus makes a similar point about the mystery of God in the sense we can never fully understand. There is no answer to the question of why the Galileans whom Pilot had killed had to die, or why it was that the specific group of eighteen on whom the Tower of Siloam fell had to be crushed under it, or any of the causalities that we encounter in our own times. The threatening tone is all but reversed by the parable that follows. The barren fig tree (a common figure of Israel in the Scriptures) is not to be cut down but nurtured in the hope it will yet bear fruit. But such patience and waiting has its limits. Further failure will bring the tree's demise. The message is clear. Already the halfway point of Lent is approaching; those who would repent have no time to lose.
