From the Pastor's Desk
Luke 13:22-30. Living Fully the Gift of Life

Luke 14:1, 7-14. Living from Within, Living from Our Hearts In Luke's Gospel, more than any other, Jesus agrees to be a dinner guest. This Gospel has many kingdom stories and most of the parables of the kingdom are on a festal context. At a feast all are happy and all are satisfied. There is no discontentment or complaints. Thus the nature of God's kingdom is the central theme of all these parables. In God's kingdom all are welcome, all have a place, all are satisfied and there is no need of any rush or packing in. God and the loving presence satiates all human needs including hunger and thirst. Humility is a funny thing. Once you think you've got it, you've lost it. It seems humility is a major theme of the readings today. If the first reading from Sirach begins with the advice to perform one's tasks with humility, in the Gospel text of today, Jesus advises choosing the lowest place as a practical way of performing one's tasks. At the cursory level, one might assume that Jesus is giving a lesson on table manners, or providing a strategy by which one can gain honour. This is true, but is only a small part of the story. A deeper reading reveals that there is much more. Jesus noticed that quests at the house were rushing in to get the so called noble seats and thus to impress the audience. And the Pharisees were rushing in to show others that they more dignified than other guests.

Jesus shocks the guests especially the ones who tried to be first in the order of seating. We live in a world that judges mainly by externals. That is why almost all cosmetic companies are thriving because most people lay too much stress on the externals. How one dresses, what brand name one chooses in dress and perfumes, what shoes one wears, etc. have become great signs of one's greatness! Sometimes we live artificial, false, empty lives in the hope that we will be given the importance and acceptance we seek. Against this background we have to read todays Word. The call and the challenge are to a different way of life. The Word today invite us to live from within, to live from our hearts. They call us to rest assured in the fact that each of us, no matter how we look externally, is a unique, special and precious one before God. Be simply ourselves, and accept ourselves fully. God wants us to be giving glory to Him in our way of being fully human. We are invited to be the best of we could be, for we are created in the form and likeness of God. Jesus our Lord has walked ahead of us showing the glorious way of living our humanity at its best. 'Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted' (Luke 14:11).

Social Justice News: This year we are observing the 102nd World Day of Migrants and Refugees. It is an occasion to celebrate the fact that Australia is graced by the life, work and gifts of generations of migrants; but also an occasion to grow in the awareness of the global phenomenon of people on the move. Pope Francis has chosen as theme: "Migrants and refugees challenge us. The response of the Gospel of Mercy." The Pope reflects on the tragic stories of men, women and children who are victims of violence, persecution and poverty. If they survive the abuses and hardships of their journey, they face suspicion and fear at their new destination as well as a lack of respect for their human rights and dignity and no proper integration programs. According to Pope Francis: "Indifference and silence lead to complicity whenever we stand by as people are dying of suffocation, starvation, violence and shipwreck. Whether large or small in scale, these are always tragedies even as a single life is lost. Migrants are our brothers and sisters in search of a better life, far away from poverty, hunger, exploitation and the unjust distribution of the planet's resources which are meant to be equitably shared by all. Don't we all want a better, more decent and prosperous life to share with our loved ones?"
