They recognized Him at the breaking of bread

Some may think that the two disciples in today's Gospel were very lucky that they met Jesus himself on their way to Emmaus. And Jesus personally explained the scriptures to them. At the end, Jesus went into the village and celebrated Eucharist with them. If Jesus, personally, had explained the scriptures to us, celebrated liturgies with us, then we would be as good as the two disciples were. So, what we don't have is luck.

Actually, this is not the case. The disciples were not just lucky. They recognized Jesus at the breaking of bread, before which, they had already been extraordinary. Firstly, they had had unforgettable faith-filled experiences: they had played a part in Jesus' Passion, walking with the suffering Messiah. Secondly, they had familiarized themselves with Moses and the Prophets: please notice that Jesus just explained the scriptures to them, He did not have to teach them the content. Thirdly, two of them had successfully formed a small faith community and shared with each other the particular faith experiences they had: "They were talking together about all that had happened". Fourthly, they had open minds: when Jesus, as a stranger, came up and walked by their side, trying to explain to them everything that had happened, they didn't refuse to listen to Him. Last, but not least, they had a loving heart: it got dark and they didn't have the heart to let Jesus continue His way alone. "They pressed Him to stay with them" and shared their food with Jesus. After all of this, the timing was right that they recognized Jesus.

In fact, if we do the same things as these two disciples did, it is assured that we will walk, live and share food with Jesus. Accordingly, we ought to do the following. Firstly, to have deep faith experiences, walking with the suffering Jesus. The way to do this is, by following the footprints of Jesus, to love our neighbours, help the needy, forgive others and be courageous to face and accept persecution for the sake of righteousness. Secondly, to familiarize ourselves with the Holy Scriptures: we should learn the content of the Bible first, then Jesus will help us comprehend it in some way. Thirdly, to form small ministry groups, sharing with one another our different faith experiences while serving our local community. To serve is the means, not the end. The real aim of ministry is to make spiritual growth and maturity of each other by serving one another. Fourthly, to keep an open mind, being humble and listening to others, even strangers. Finally, to have a loving heart, being happy to share food and wealth with others. Otherwise, though Jesus had walking and talking with us for a long time, we wouldn't finish the last step, sharing meals with Him and recognizing His identity.

Dear friends, Jesus has done everything he could for our salvation, now it is up to us to do our part. Mind you, we will never enter the Kingdom of Heaven unless we try really hard. There are no shortcuts for it. No pain, no gain. By following the footsteps of these two disciples, with loving heart and humility, relying on the strength of the Word and being in the community, let us walk towards Jesus and meet Him in our daily lives.
