From the Pastor's Desk

Luke 19:1-10: Letting Myself be Changed and Letting Jesus Find Us

Luke narrates the episode of Zacchaeus so his readers would better discover what they can expect of Jesus: the Lord they invoke and follow in the Christian Communities 'has come to seek out and save what was lost'. They (and we) must never forget it. At the same time, the story of what Zacchaeus does, helps to answer the question that many of us carry within: Can I still change? Isn't it by now too late to redo a life that, for the most part, has gone to waste and meaninglessness? What step can I take? Zacchaeus enters the scene, described in two ways that define his life precisely. He is one of the senior tax collectors and is wealthy. In Jericho everyone knows that he is a sinner. Someone who doesn't serve God but serves money. His life, like so many others, isn't very humane. But this man was trying to see Jesus and that surprises the reader/ listener. It is not just curiosity, but he really wants to know who Jesus is, what it is about this prophet that so attracts the crowd. This was not an easy thing for a man snug within his own world. So something good is in him and this desire for Jesus will change his life fully. Impediments are many: he is short in size; and up to now his life was not motivated by very noble ideas; and the people are another impediment. But the man keeps at his quest simply and sincerely. He runs to get ahead of the crowd, and climbs a tree like a child. He only wants to find a moment and a place adequate to make contact with Jesus. He wants to see the prophet who attracts people.

Jesus sees him and the meeting will be at this sinner's house. Zacchaeus comes down and welcomes Jesus in his house full of joy. Like in this man, there are decisive moments when Jesus passes through our life because he wants to save our wasted life. He won't let us escape from it. Luke is concerned, not about the meeting, but only of Zacchaeus' transformation. He changes his ways of looking at life; he will do justice for those he has exploited and will share his goods with the poor. Jesus' mission was to seek out and save what was lost. To be found by Jesus meant that Zacchaeus had to give up and lose much of himself. We believers in Jesus need to know that a more authentic meeting with Jesus can make our life more human and, above all, more in solidarity. And, when we take a small step towards the Lord, we discover that he has already taken a giant step towards us.

It is definitely Wednesday 2nd November Social Justice News: In August we have written a letter to Mr. Turnbull, Mr. Shorten, Mr. Scullion. Mr. Vasta, Mr Chalmers and Prof. Jillian Triggs about the high incarceration rates of indigenous people in the justice system and about the mistreatment of children in the Northern Territory Youth Detention Centre. We have received two answers, from Prof. Triggs stating that the Human Rights Commission advocates constantly on these important issues and from Mr.Scullion, the Minister for Indigenous Affairs informing us that the government is spending \$4.9 billion over 4 years to Improve outcomes for indigenous people. Also, the outcome of the Royal Commission into the Protection and Detention of Children in the NT is expected to be completed by 31/3/2017. If you wish to read the letters they are on the church door.

This weekend we will also finalize our mail for Africa so please sign the Christmas cards to the girls in Zambia and to Dr. Hamlin after each Mass. Thank you Santa Teresa Pilgrimage Retreat Day: The Parish retreat was a gift of mercy to us. The beauty, peace and thoughtful prayer areas at Santa Teresa provided a moving stimulus for reflection, prayer, offering and stillness. The input from Sr Kari was thought provoking and interesting. One of my favourites was the Cana prayer space where we could reflect on any troubles we had, make a prayer for a new start and could then wash our hands in the large jars as a symbol of starting anew.
