Sixth Sunday of Easter - Year C 1st May 2016

From the Pastor's Desk

John 14:23-29: Live out the message of love and be united in Christ. A few years after the death and resurrection of Jesus, the early Christian community is debating about what makes a Christian and a disciple of Jesus. Their focus is on the external, the circumcision on the body and many other practices they borrowed from their Jewish background. They were all, including the apostles, primarily Jews observing the religious practices of their tradition. However, even as they debated they realized that this is not what Jesus had intended at all. The early Church had its problems, much as we do today. The biggest problem stemmed from the admission of the Gentile community. Since Jesus was a Jew, and almost all of the early followers, apostles and disciples were Jewish and followed all the Jewish laws and practices while still believing in Jesus the Messiah, it stood to reason that they would expect everyone to be like them. To be a follower of Jesus the Nazarene would mean that you would also follow the laws and practices of the Jewish faith as well. Maybe, many of them saw the Way of Jesus as a new turn or a reform within the Jewish faith. But Paul did not see it that way and when Paul went out converting Gentile communities to Christian faith, he did not have them follow the prescripts of the Jewish law which would involve circumcision, apparel, practices, purity regulations in food, and so on. According to the first reading today, Paul had quite a debate with the Jewish Christians, but neither side would give in. The post resurrection era is the Spiritan era, the Holy Spirit takes over and renews everything in Christ. It is the same Spirit of God working through the whole church as one who is able to influence, change and renew and create oneness in the Church as Vatican II highlights.

Jesus in the Gospel reminds us that the Holy Spirit, abiding within us, is our teacher and the source of all peace. The passage offers a vision of hope. Jesus the Christ promises us that the Spirit sent by the Father would instruct, inspire, guide and lead the community on the way of Jesus. We are told to prepare ourselves for Pentecost, the great event in Christianity and it is to be continued at the end of every Easter season. Let us be aware of the abiding presence of God within us. And we are not alone. One of the great social and ethical problems of our time is isolation and loneliness. Jesus can always be present to us and be a friend in our life. He takes away our grief, and shares with us his joy, peace, and guides our path into light - I am the way, truth and Life, He told Thomas in his discourse. As a parish community we allow ourselves to be guided by the Spirit of God and we will surely be the light of the world and salt of the earth as Jesus wanted us to be.
