Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God 1st January 2017

Pastor's Note:

Luke 2:16-21: Incarnation! Emmanuel! Happy New Year!

The world around us celebrates the New Year and the Church highlights this feast of Mary as the Mother of God. It is the oldest of all Marian feasts in our liturgy. We begin a New Year, the public holiday that marks the end of the holiday season, and the beginning of any number of other things from changing calendars to keeping accounts of various sorts. In everyone's eyes it is a special day, a new beginning, a New Year Day. I is a day that begins consciously at midnight on new year's Eve with parties, fireworks, bells, and street theatre, and is ended by the television channels showing how this day. has been celebrated around the world. There are other new year's days, like Jewish New Year, Muslim New Year, Chinese New Year, Sanskrit New Year, and many cultures and peoples have their own new year day, but this is the calendar day that is most widely celebrated and unanimously accepted as the New Year Day around the globe. So a difference is there in the celebration of the world and the Church! This feast is that of Mary's greatest tittle Theotokos (literally means God-bearer), and this feast goes back to very early days of the church, honouring Mary in relation to the Word Made Flesh mystery of Incarnation.

The Church is focusing on one thing; that in our attempt to understand God. we grow in comprehension of the meaning of the Incarnation in our world and life. It is in this light that we reflect on Virgin Mary, Theotokos, Mother of God. mother of Jesus Incarnate. And just as Mary interpreted all things, pondered all things in her heart, so does the church reflect on her and the Incarnation through its liturgy, its writings and its faith. That is why her oldest feast is celebrated within the octave of Christmas, of Emmanuel, of God with us. And we are reminded of the words of Elizabeth, Blessed are you among women. and blessed is the fruit of your womb! And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? (Luke 1:42-43). The Gospel we listen today is almost an exact repeat of what was read at the Dawn Mass on Christmas. In Luke, Mary represents the ideal believer, for she hears the good news and ponders it in her heart and fully responds to it. Her heart becomes the place of discovering Jesus, and who he really is. We are invited at the beginning of a new year that our own hearts must become that place of response to God and the love of God revealed in Jesus, the Emmanuel. Mary's entire life, and the Church's entire life, is centred on that process of pondering who that child that born to us really is. Mary, contemplating her son, becomes the Church reflecting on Incarnation. It is this aspect of Mary's motherhood that is most important to our new year, the year in which we continue our journey of the heart towards God. Mary gives us an example of what our choice as Christians really implies: that each genuine choice we make reveals who we really are and is not simply what we do. Christian, human freedom of choice is not about choosing which film or movie we will go to see, or what we will wear, or what we will own; it is about how we reveal and define ourselves on that journey to God and His love. Finally, Mary's choice was not right or wrong, it stemmed from who she was and new herself to be a daughter of Israel, a child of God. We open our eyes and hearts on this New Year Day to see the face of God, the Word Made Flesh, born of the virgin Mary. Wish you a Great and Blessed New Year! 2017!

Monday 2nd January is the feast day of Saints Basil the Great and Gregory Nazianzen

Basil: Born about 330 at Caesarea (Turkey). **Died** there on 1 January 379. First a hermit, then bishop of his native city. **Remembered** for his pioneering monastic rule, and for writings which developed the doctrines of the incarnation and of the divinity of the Holy Spirit.

Gregory: Born at Nazianzus (Turkey) in 329.

Died there in 389. Also a hermit before becoming bishop of Constantinople. Remembered as the "Theologian" because of his wisdom and acumen in maintaining orthodox doctrine against the Arians. Basil and Gregory are commemorated together because of their friendship in life and their enduring influence on the Church, especially in the East.


