Second Sunday of Advent (Year B) 10th December 2023

Readings: Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11 2 Peter 3:8-14 Mark 1:1-8

John the Baptist and his teaching

John the Baptist is "to prepare the way of the Lord and make straight His paths". Without much ado Mark described how, "John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins." Later, Mark also described how John lived, and what he ate and wore. The curious thing about John's preaching is that 'people of the whole Judean country-side and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to him and being baptized by him in the river Jordan, and they acknowl-edged their sins."

John certainly was not the first one to preach about repentance for sins. Others had constantly reminded people to leave their sinful paths and turn to God like; Joel, Isaiah, Job, Jeremiah, and Jonah. So, what was so special about John's message? There are three answers to this question. The first is that John himself was filled with the Holy Spirit. We need to note that during the visitation of Mary, the moment Mary's greeting reached Elizabeth's ears, the child (John) in her womb leapt for joy. The second reason is that it was John who was seen baptizing people in the Jordan. And the third is that it was John alone who tells them directly, "one mightier than I, is coming after me. I am not worthy to stoop and loosen the thongs of His sandals. I have baptized you with water but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

As we follow the message of John in preparation to receive Jesus, we have our job cut out for us. We have no excuse to say we do not know what we are expected to do and how. The first requirement for us is to invite the Holy Spirit to fill us with His presence. The second requirement is to repent of our sins and make our paths straight so that our lives, point to someone else more important than ourselves (Jesus). Like John, our lives should show that we have found another reason to live our lives differently. The third point to remember is to be authentic and truthful in all humility about who we Christians are and what our task is. This is easier said than done.

What our preparation during this season of Advent can do is to lead us steadily to repentance and to expect the coming of someone – the Lord Jesus Christ - who alone can set us on the right path and give us real self-worth. What more as true Christians would we look for and require for Christmas than the glory of God being revealed through us and people able to witness it in our life? Would that not make our Christmas, our whole life, a joyful one?

The Advent wreath is to remind us of both the immortality of our souls and God's promise of everlasting life to us through Christ. **The four candles** represent the four weeks of Advent, and one candle is lit each Sunday.

First candle / Sunday: HOPE (The Prophecy Candle).

Second candle / Sunday: PEACE (The Bethlehem Candle): It is a reminder that the Christ-child will bring peace to a troubled world.

Third candle / Sunday: JOY (The Shepherd's Candle). Fourth candle / Sunday: LOVE (The Angel's Candle).
