

Justice System to Follow

The Justice system is very difficult to handle. It tries to bring justice to people as quickly as possible but sometimes it is very difficult to follow. While courts certainly provide one way of settling our conflicts, Jesus provided nearly two thousand years ago another set of simple rules to settle conflicts, which we find in today's Gospel. I notice that his very first advice, i.e., "if your brother or sister sins against you, go and point out their fault, just between the two of you. If they listen to you, you have won them over," is rarely followed. In our case, whenever there is a conflict or someone has wronged us, our first reaction is to either get angry or get hurt, and then find ways to get even with that person or group. And the next thing we are found doing is criticising and speaking against that person or group to everyone we meet. Instead of solving the problem, it makes the situation worse for both sides. But if, at least as Christians, we were to follow, with openness and truthfulness, the simple piece of advice Jesus is offering in the Gospel, our conflicts can be solved right then and there. And indeed, how nice it would be to have it all done in private without the whole world getting to know about it.

But supposing that does not work, Jesus then proposes a second simple step, which is, "if they will not listen, take one or two others along, so that 'every matter may be established by the testimony of two or three witnesses.'" Of course, as mentioned above, openness and truthfulness are the two most important things to be remembered while settling issues, and one often faces a real problem here. Each party thinks that his/her side is right and that it is the other person who is wrong. The person who has already committed the wrong might even take a stand that the two or three witnesses, the wronged party is brining with him/her are going to support the opposite side.

And therefore, Jesus cleverly offers a third simple step to resolve our conflicts. He says, "if they still refuse to listen, tell it to the Church; and if they refuse to listen even to the Church, treat them as you would treat a pagan or a tax collector."

Jesus is offering us wise and practical advice to deal with our interpersonal relationship problems or even other issues like property and wealth. But how many of us care to take these simple steps to settle our family or neighbourhood, or other types of problems? Jesus' advice of telling it to the Church" does not necessarily mean that we need to go to the Bishop or the Parish Priests, religious and retired elders or members of the parish Council who can and should play this role on behalf of the Church.

Reflecting as Christians about the world, which has already so many problems of its own and where objects are valued more than persons, our effort and indeed our role should be that of healers and peacemakers. "Blessed are the Peacemakers...." said Jesus during His sermon on the mount. But, before being healers and peacemakers, we need to be healed and be at peace with ourselves.

FAITH MATTERS: The Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows

The 15th of September marks the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, (sometimes referred to as Our Lady of Dolours) and on which we participate in the Catholic devotion to the Seven Sorrows of Mary.

The heart that resembles that of Christ more than any other is without doubt the heart of his mother, Mary. Traditionally in art, the heart of Mary is depicted in a wide variety of ways. Probably the most poignant way is when Mary is depicted with the seven wounds or seven swords, in remembrance of her seven sorrows. It highlights the pain which Mary felt at various stages throughout her life. Pain is indeed very hard to cope with. It can come from many sources, but it is perhaps most punishing when it attacks us through a loved one. For Mary, to see her beloved son suffer and die in front of her eyes was the deepest of pain any human can experience.

Though the scenes of the Seven Sorrows vary slightly, the seven most commonly depicted are: the prophecy of Simeon foretelling Mary's suffering; the flight into Egypt to escape the killing of the infants; the loss of the child Jesus in the Temple, in which Mary and Joseph lose Christ for three days; Mary's meeting with Christ carrying the cross to Mount Calvary; the crucifixion itself; Mary taking the body of Christ down from the cross; and finally placing the body of Christ in the tomb.

Season of Creation Mass and Discussion: Catholic Earthcare and the Catholic Justice and Peace Commission (CJPC), are hosting a Season of Creation with Mass at the Cathedral of St Stephen this Saturday, 9th September, presided by Archbishop Mark Coleridge.
