Readings: Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14-16 1 Corinthians 10:16-17 John 6:51-58

A Profound Interior Conversion

June 5 is World Environment Day. A day that highlights the wonder and fragility of 'our common home'- planet Earth. A day that calls us to reflect on the state of the natural world and humanity's impact on the planet. A day that entreats sustaining or restorative action. The 2023 theme is Beat Plastic Pollution and calls upon each of us to do all that we can to eliminate or limit single-use plastics.

However, this reflection addresses a broader and overarching issue of excessive consumerism or over-consumption. Over-consumption is a preoccupation with consuming more and more goods and services, often based, not on need, but rather on the appeal of the goods themselves. Clever marketing strategies and lifestyles choices play a part. Whatever the reason, the consequences of over-consumption can be devastating, for both the planet and humanity.

A recent United Nations Report concluded that if everybody in the world consumed resources at the rate people do in the 38 OECD (Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development) countries, the equivalent of 3.3 earths would be needed to keep up consumption levels. Disturbing, given that there is no planet B.

We are also warned that we are devouring the planet's resources at 1.7 times faster than we can regenerate them. Excessive consumption of goods and services (energy, land, water, materials,) causes detrimental effects to the environment and subsequently, humanity. Natural resources, such as forests, fish, soil, minerals, rivers and water ways are depleted, ecosystems are compromised and species endangered or worse. Often pollution results from over-production, both in the manufacturing stage with air and water pollution, and waste in the discarding stage, given the short life that is built into many products (obsolescence).

While buying and selling have no moral or spiritual implications in themselves, motives and attitudes behind these can. Consumerism can go beyond maintaining a healthy economy and enter the realm of materialism. Chronic dissatisfaction, envy and greed can result in buying more, more often, to acquire the latest, the best. However, Jesus warns: "Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions." Luke 12:15 Consumerism alone will not bring authentic security or contentment in life. We are challenged to place our hope, "not in such an uncertain thing as riches" ... but "to be rich in good works, to be generous and ready to share with others" 1 Timothy 6 17-18

For Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, respect and care for Country means life itself. Maintaining balance, and nurturing the connection, taking only what is needed to ensure natural resources are never exhausted is foremost. Stewardship of the natural world and this 'taking only what is needed' speaks directly to the temptation and sin of over-consumption.

Newsletter Reflection continued from Page 1

In his 2015 Encyclical, 'Laudato Si', Pope Francis directly confronts the sin of "excessive consumption and compulsive consumerism", naming them 'as threats to environmental stewardship' (Pope Francis 2015). He draws a direct relationship between these and pollution, habitat destruction and resource depletion - which further extends the "suffering of the excluded". Laudato Si' is a call to change the way we live: to decrease our consumption and to think of the planet and future generations.

And so it is apt for each of us to reflect on our consumption patterns. Pausing to think about how we consume, what we consume and our relationship with this 'stuff' can highlight some tensions and a commitment to make adjustments. Pope Francis calls us to a 'profound interior conversion or change of heart' so that, through little daily actions, our duty to care for creation, all of creation, is realised bit by bit.

The Social Justice Group

The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus: is celebrated on the third Friday after Pentecost. This devotion, which dates back to the Middle Ages, flowered in France in the seventeenth century as a result of the visions of Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque (16 October). The feast was extended to the entire Western Church by Pius IX in 1856. It recalls the mystery of God who is love, and honours the heart of Jesus as the source and centre of the incarnate love of God.

The Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary: This commemoration celebrates Mary as the model of ready acceptance of God's will in all life's circumstances. It was instituted by Pius XII for the octave day of the Assumption and was moved by Paul VI in 1969 to the Saturday after the

feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.


