### Third Sunday of Lent (Year A)

## 12th March 2023

Readings: Exodus 17:3-7 Romans 5:1-2, 5-8 John 4:5-16,19-26,39-42 International Women's Day 2023

Every year, on the 8th March, International Women's Day is observed. In some parts of the world women celebrate their achievements in social, economic and political spheres. In many other parts, women remain unacknowledged, side-lined or even enslaved, and must struggle for their dignity.

In 1995, the United Nations' 4th Conference on Women, held in Beijing, examined the status of women and mapped a path for a better future. The aim was to remove obstacles limiting female participation in all areas of life, so that they have an equal and full share in economic, social, cultural and political decision making. Thirty thousand women from 189 countries attended. For this occasion, Pope St. John Paul II wrote an amazing "Letter to Women". It began with thanks to all women because "Through the insight, which is so much part of your womanhood, you enrich the world's understanding and help to make human relations more honest and authentic." However, the Pope acknowledged that Women's dignity has often been unacknowledged... they have been relegated to the margins of society and even reduced to servitude... resulting in a spiritual impoverishment of humanity. When it comes to setting women free from every kind of exploitation ... we have to go back to the attitude of Jesus himself..... Jesus treated women with openness, respect, acceptance and tenderness." The meeting of Jesus with the Samaritan woman in today's gospel, vividly portrays his attitude. (John 4:5-16, 19–26, 39-42) How have we heard and acted upon the example of Jesus today?

It is 28 years since the conference and the Pope's Letter. Yet social attitudes towards women have not changed significantly, if at all, in some parts of the world. Gender inequality remains one of the most pervasive forms of inequality worldwide. It denies women their voices, devalues their work and makes women's position unequal in every domain – in households, communities, nationally and globally. In January 2023, the World Economic Forum confirmed that women are disproportionally represented among the world's poor. The global gender pay gap is 68.1%. It might take up to 132 years to reach gender parity. And so, the theme for International Women's Day 2023 is Embrace Equity. Equity recognises that women and men often do not have the same starting point in many of life's activities. Adjustments need to be made with tailored resources and opportunities to overcome imbalance and deliver equality, fairness and justice.

Education is a basic human right. Yet only 49% of countries have gender equality in education. 129 million girls are excluded from schooling for a variety of reasons such as government restrictions, grinding poverty, violence and harassment in schools and a raft of dangers, including kidnapping, on the way to school. An alarming world-wide problem is the growing culture of violence towards women at home, at work and in public places. Even in our own country Australia, 50 women were killed by violence in 2022. Consider how family members and friends will be affected for the rest of their lives by these senseless killings. Furthermore, we need to think of our sisters in countries like Afghanistan and Iran. In Afghanistan women have lost all their rights to education, to the choice of work, to personal determination. They simply have to obey the commands of the male members of their families. Women in Iran are being arrested and punished for freedoms that we take for granted.

The challenges are enormous, the need for prayer and action undeniable. What part can you play?

# Faith Matters: Third Sunday of Lent

Human life depends on water. If we think about the significance of water in our own lives we may be struck by the generosity of water: immersing, cleansing, refreshing, thirst quenching, life-sustaining. In our Christian tradition, water is a life-giving symbol of our baptism.

Reading John's gospel, it is almost as if the Samaritan woman and Jesus had a planned appointment at the well of Sychar. Pope Francis writes of their encounter as part of their need, their searching for more than thirst quenching water:

The outcome of that encounter by the well was the woman's transformation: "the woman left her water jar" (v. 28) and ran to the city to tell people about her extraordinary experience. "I found a man who told me all that I ever did. Can this be the Christ?" She had found another kind of water, the living water of mercy from which gushes forth eternal life.

#### As we make our Lenten journey we pray ...

That we become free to witness to Christ in our prayer, our fasting and our alms-giving.

That we are encouraged to 'leave behind our inner water jar, the symbol of everything that is seemingly important, but loses all its value before the love of God'.

That we recognise Jesus as the living water who transforms us 'to worship in spirit and in truth.'

The principal gathering of the Archdiocese of Brisbane in 2023 SUMMIT23 is a three-day gathering of clergy, religious, educators, catechists, lay leaders and communities from across the Archdiocese of Brisbane for keynote presentations, workshops, panel
