Memories of St Peter's

It is my absolute pleasure to write to you about my beloved parents, Charlie and Monica O'Leary, and just some of the contributions they made to the opening up of, and continuing success of the parish of St Peter's, Rochedale. My parents lived on Underwood Road and operated an earth moving business (whilst Dad worked as a motorcycle cop, and they raised their seven children). The business had a few names but older Rochedale residents will remember 'Mr Fill' and 'O'Leary Rochedale' being painted on the arms of various excavators and trucks. As a proud Catholic Irish Australian, our Dad always told the story of how it was 'just right' that he dug the foundations for both the church of St Peter's, and the Springwood Pub!

Our family had a wonderful relationship with the founding priest, Father Rollo Enright. He was often at our house for dinner on Friday nights, and would listen patiently and laugh loudly at the antics of all seven little O'Leary kids. He was a beautiful man, with a very deep voice, a big heart and a hearty laugh. One time, Dad managed to find an old car for a really cheap price and would drive us endlessly around the back paddock, as we all had to have turns doing laps as the driver on his lap. I clearly remember Father Enright being there and happily joining in on quite a few of the laps, as we all took turns to steer the wheel. It was Father Enright who managed to find the famous 'St Peter's rock' that sits out the front of our church. He had found it somewhere in his home town of Beaudesert and it was Dad's happy job to take one of his trucks down there, pick up the massive rock, and place it into the position it still holds to this day. I often think about just how many happy children have climbed up and sat on that rock as their parents have chatted. Dad's own grandchildren attended St Peter's School many years later and we are so lucky to have pictures of them on that very rock. Dad always told the story of how Father Enright had envisioned a 'colonial Australia' type building for the new St Peter's Church, and how he wanted a nice, big, open verandah as a place for parishioners to meet and feel welcome. That was certainly achieved.

When St Peter's Primary School opened, Mum was delighted to be given the job as the founding teacher, along with the other person on staff, the founding Principal, Sr Lynn. My youngest sister, Megan, was in that very first year, with Mum as her teacher! Mum would tell us the story of how, when the school was picking house names, she was asked if she would agree to one being called, 'O'Leary House'. Ever humble, and worried about hearing her surname screamed out at sports carnivals for many years, she declined, and they went with another name. Mum absolutely loved teaching at St Peter's and did so for many, many years, making many friends. We were all so lucky to benefit by those friendships and connections made in the early years, and marvel that we are all still in contact with quite a few of the early families from then. One of Mum's proudest achievements was getting her bus license so that she could drive the school kids to and from Laurie Lawrence Swim School. The actual bus was hilarious, as it was fairly old looking, had been painted by the Youth Group of the time, under the watchful eye of one of the dads, Michael Murphy, who was a great painter and artist in our parish.

Flowers to decorate the church: If any individuals or families would like to donate flowers to decorate the church especially for weekend Masses, please contact the Parish Office.



FAITH MATTERS: St Martin of Tours (316-397AD)

Born of pagan parents in what is now Hungary, and raised in Italy, this son of a veteran was forced at the age of 15 to serve in the army. Legend has it that while still in the military and a catechumen of the faith, Martin cut his cloak in half to share it with a beggar. That night, he dreamed that Jesus himself was clothed with the torn cloak. When he awoke, his garment was restored. Moved by this vision and apparent miracle, Martin immediately finished his religious instruction and was baptized at age 18.

On leaving the Roman army, Martin settled at Poitiers, under the guidance of Bishop Hilary. He became a missionary in the provinces of Pannonia and Illyricum (now in the Balkan Peninsula), where he opposed Arianism, a heresy that denied the divinity of Christ.

Martin then founded a community of hermits at Ligugé, the first monastery in France. In 371 he was made bishop of Tours, and outside that city he founded another monastery, Marmoutier.

As bishop, Martin made Marmoutier a great monastic complex from which apostles spread Christianity throughout France.

He himself was an active missionary in Touraine and in the country districts of France where Christianity was as yet barely known. During his lifetime, Martin acquired a reputation as a miracle worker, and he was one of the first non-martyrs to be publicly venerated as a saint.

May we practice the same faithfulness, humility & care for the poor as St Martin did.
