The Sixth Sunday of Easter: Priority: Engaging Anew with First Nations Peoples

Archbishop Mark writes: The injustice done to First Nations peoples in this country is a running sore at the heart of the nation. It is contemporary Australia's original sin... We need a genuinely new engagement of the Church with the First Nations peoples, especially in an Archdiocese like this where the Indigenous presence is strong. A new engagement will mean, first of all, listening to Indigenous voices, and believing that we can learn if we really listen. In the past, non-Indigenous Australia has struggled to believe that we could learn anything from First Nations peoples. They could learn from us, but not we from them. That has to change, both in the Church and in Australia more generally. Then the listening and learning need to lead to action.

The Spirit of Truth: Truth telling means the "process of openly sharing historical truths after periods of conflict to allow societies to move forward in a more inclusive way, based on justice and human rights." So, let's begin with some truth telling.

The 1788 arrival of the First Fleet resulted in cautious friendships being formed between the First Australians and the British Empire. Within three years, relations soured as settlers spread out across the land. Researchers now estimate that more than 10,000 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people were killed in 403 massacres.

It was not until 1962 that First Nations people were granted the right to vote, and it was 1967 when First Nations peoples were counted on the Australian census. This appalling history of the mistreatment of First Nations Peoples continues to impact First Nations Peoples. According to a 2021 survey, 52.1% of First Nations people surveyed reported "experiencing at least one form of major discrimination, such as unfairly being denied a job or unfairly discouraged from continuing education." Today, child mortality is at twice the rate compared with non-First Nations children. About 1 in 4 First Nations students in Years 5, 7 and 9 remain below national minimum standards for reading. In 2018-19, around 34 percent of First Nations youth aged 20-24 had not attained Year 12 or equivalent. Just over half of all young people in detention on an average night in June 2019 were First Nations Australians.

On February 13, 2008, then Prime Minister Kevin Rudd said, "we apologise for the laws and policies of successive Parliaments and governments that have inflicted profound grief, suffering and loss on these our fellow Australians."

The Spirit of Love: Love is a verb – it's a doing word – it requires action. St Mary MacKillop reminds us, "never see a need without doing something about it." We are called to engage anew – to love – to listen, and to do all we can to bring true reconciliation in our nation.

The history of mistreatment of First Nations Peoples in Australia is sobering. The Uluru Statement, endorsed by the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, states, "Makarrata is the culmination of our agenda: the coming together after a struggle. It captures our aspirations for a fair and truthful relationship with the people of Australia and a better future for our children based on justice and self-determination." The Archdiocese of Brisbane has adopted a Reconciliation Action Plan. Let us support them.

FAITH MATTERS: Fatima

MAY 13 is the feast of Our Lady of Fatima.

This feast commemorates the visions of Our Lady seen near Fátima in Portugal in 1917 by three shepherd children, Lúcia dos Santos and her cousins Jacinta and Francisco Marto. There were three appearances to the children in 1916 of the "Angel of Peace," who emphasized the importance of prayer and sacrifice, the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament and the reparation to be offered. Mary first appeared on May 13, Mother's Day, 1917. The visions occurred on the 13th day of each month. There were six apparitions, the last October 13, during which the sun spun in the sky and then hurtled to the earth before it resumed its place.

Our Lady highlighted the daily recitation of the Rosary, the importance of doing one's "daily duty" – God being present with and the purpose of your daily work – and the need for reparation.

Pope John Paul II was devoted to Our Lady of Fátima and attributed his survival of an assassin's bullet on 13 May 1981 to her intervention. Jacinta and Francisco Marto, who died in the great Spanish Flu pandemic of 1919-20, were beatified on 13 May 2000. A bullet that was fired at Pope John Paul II was retrieved from the papal vehicle and is mounted inside the crown of the statue of Our Lady of Fatima in Fatima in Portugal.

The Lord's Day

When the COVID pandemic struck, I joined other bishops in deciding for a dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. Now that the pandemic seems to be receding, it is good for us to reflect not only upon the Sunday obligation but upon the meaning of Sunday itself. To call the first day of the week Sunday recalls the Roman name, but from the first Christians always called it the Lord's Day, in honour of the Risen Christ who is the true light of the world and the source of life. The Lord's Day was the weekly Easter and the weekly Pentecost, because on the first day Jesus Christ rose from the dead and breathed the Holy Spirit into the Church. It was the day that looked back to the first day of creation and forward to the last day of the Lord's return in glory. Even in times of persecution, Christians remained faithful unto death to the assembly of the Lord's Day. The spontaneous practice of the early days eventually became Church law. Yet it is not law that draws us to Mass but the Lord's desire to eat the Passover with us (cf Luke 22:15). The deepest reason we go to Mass on Sunday is not because we have decided or because the Church's requires it but because we are drawn there by his desire for us. In coming to Mass, we surrender to the Lord's love and let ourselves be drawn by him who wants to speak to our heart and share his feast with us. Therefore, in the Archdiocese of Brisbane from Pentecost Sunday of this year (28 May) the pandemic dispensation will be withdrawn and the Sunday obligation will be restored, so that all of us, responding to the Risen Lord's call, may say with one heart and voice, "This is the day which the Lord has made: let us rejoice and be glad" (Psalm 118:24).
