### To be a good Christian and a good citizen

Please enjoy reading the reflection below written by Samuel Chamberlain who is a Member of the Parish Pastoral Council & the Co-ordinator of the Evangelisation Task Group. *Fr Baiyi*

**"Do not put your trust in princes, in human beings, who cannot save." Psalms 146: 3**

There is decreasing trust in Australia's institutions. Our political system, the media, the bureaucracy are all being viewed with more scepticism by an increasing number of Australians. The upcoming federal election will give some people optimism for the future. Others may be more downcast about our prospects.

It is important to remember two things. The first is that **it is a moral duty to give serious consideration for whom you vote. You should consider which candidates will promote justice and righteousness** and be grateful to have the opportunity to vote, a privilege that not every person has. The second thing to remember is that politics cannot save. Politicians will always fail you. They are bound to fail because they are humans. But God never fails and he is always true to his promises.

We at St Peter's Catholic Parish Rochedale invite you at this time, when you are considering what is best for the future of this country, to reflect upon your relationship between yourself and God. We invite you to make this reflection because of the following reality: if you don't worship God, you will worship something, or anything, else. It is hard not to see the idols of our time. Whether it be careerism, or the pride found in titles, or the fervour directed towards political figures, idols are abundant in our culture. These will not provide you with the fulfilment that you think they will.

St Augustine said "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you." Our hearts can only be complete when we orientate our lives towards what humans were designed for. Humanity has an innate desire to be in a relationship with the creator and saviour of the universe. Think about it. We live in the most prosperous, wealthy, healthy, educated, entertained, technologically advanced and connected period in human history. And yet we are beleaguered with the same slings and arrows of fate and misfortune as every generation of humans that has preceded us. Family breakdown, personal moral failings, hatred towards one another are all things that existed in antiquity that still persist in our world today.

Christian theologian C.S Lewis provided us with a logical conclusion for humanity not being able to be satisfied with worldly things or to solve our worldly problems: "If we find ourselves with a desire that nothing in this world can satisfy, the most probable explanation is that we were made for another world." As we are created by God, imbued with his Dignity, and orientated towards His Love and Truth, only in seeking him and guarding his commandments do we come to peace.

St Peter's Parish invites you in this time of national tumult to visit our Parish and to join us for Mass. We boldly proclaim the Good News of the Gospel of Jesus Christ and invite all members of the local community to live out the Gospel message in their daily lives.

Remember when voting to do your civic duty but also to remember that Jesus said: "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

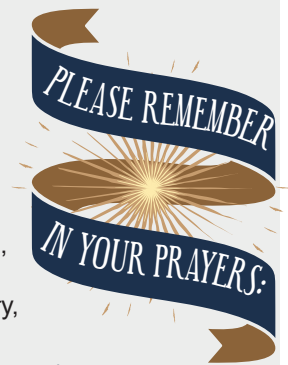

## Faith Matters: The Feast of our Lady of Fatima

May 13 is the anniversary of the apparition of Our Lady to three shepherd children in the small village of Fatima in Portugal in 1917. She appeared six times to Lucia, 9, and her cousins Francisco, 8, and his sister Jacinta, 6, between May 13, 1917 and October, 1917.

The story of Fatima begins in 1916, when, against the backdrop of the First World War and a year before the Communist revolution in Russia. First an "Angel of peace" appeared urging them to accept the sufferings which awaited them, as an act of reparation for the sins which offend Him (Our Lord), and to pray constantly for the conversion of sinners.

Then, on the 13th day of the month of Our Lady, May 1917, an apparition of a woman holding a rosary in her hand. The woman asked them to pray and devote themselves to the Holy Trinity and to "say the Rosary every day, to bring peace to the world and an end to the war." Our Lady appeared to the children on the 13th of the month from May until October declaring "My Immaculate Heart will triumph".

Today we are urged to pray for peace in our troubled world, especially in Ukraine so take the opportunity to pray the rosary, at home with your family or individually, also

- in our parish come along to pray the rosary on a Friday morning before the 9.30am Mass.

- on Tuesday evening 24th May at 7.30pm there will be a devotion and rosary in honour of Our Lady Help of Christians in the church.

"To you, who shine on our journey as a sign of salvation and hope, do we entrust ourselves, O Clement, O Loving, O Sweet Virgin Mary. Amen." Pope Francis.
