Fifth Sunday of Lent (Year B) 17th March 2024

Readings: Jeremiah 31:31-34 Hebrews 5:7-9 John 12:20-33

A Call to Dying to Self and Others

Right from Ash Wednesday to Good Friday, the Church reminds us of all profound truths of life and death, leading us ultimately to eternal life. The great philosophers, like Plato, Aristotle, Socrates were Greeks. Greece was then known to be the centre of knowledge and wisdom. Paul was keen on preaching to the Greeks and that is why he went to Athens and preached not only at the Areopagus but also in Corinth, Galatia, Thessalonica and so on. Interestingly, it is from this great world that we find people approaching Jesus' disciples to see Jesus. This certainly indicates that something great is in the offing though nothing more is heard of their meeting with Jesus. One wonders then why John introduces the Greeks in today's Gospel, except to say that they have come to celebrate the Passover feast, the most important Jewish festival.

What is worth noting is that, instead of meeting the said Greeks, Jesus bursts into something quite serious, and begins to speak about the dying of a seed to produce fruit. Jesus says that my hour has come and I am troubled now. These are rather strange words, considering the Passover is a joyful festival to celebrate freedom from Egyptian slavery.

The dying of the seed to bear fruit is simply a reference to Jesus' own death, and means His hearers understand that only dying can produce fruit. While revealing that about Himself, Jesus tells His hearers about the futility of trying to preserve one's life. That is why He adds immediately, whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life. It is indeed important for us to understand that, when a grain is not planted, it remains alone. It has practically no use, except for its own existence. But if it must produce fruit, it has no choice but to die first. Let us remember that God could have surely saved the world by other means than letting His Son die. Jesus says, "Whoever wants to be My disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake, will save it."

Denying oneself seems one of the most difficult things for us, because all the time we want more and better things that we think give us status, comfort, and pleasure. And Jesus' call goes beyond merely denying oneself but like the grain, a call to dying. This profound truth about death and dying also disturbs Jesus at first. He says, "I am troubled now", and in another place, He prays, "Father, if it is possible, take away this cup from Me..." But what makes Jesus go ahead is the confirmation He and all the others received after He has prayed, "Father, glorify Your name." The voice comes from heaven, "I have glorified it and will glorify it again."

Next Sunday is Palm Sunday. It is as good a time as any to reflect and see how we have spent nearly five weeks of Lent. What new insights did we get? What does denying ourselves or losing or preserving one's life really mean?

FAITH MATTERS: Fifth Sunday in Lent – Reflection on the Dying Seed

Today's Gospel relates to Jesus telling his audience of Greek visitors amongst other things that the seed needs to die so that it may flower again and produce a rich harvest. Of course, it is Jesus referring to his own death and resurrection but there is a good message in that picture for us personally as well.

In this passage Jesus tells us that anyone who clings on to this worldly life as we know it, will lose their life in eternity with Him. He promises that God the Father will honour those who serve Jesus and follow Him.

Despite His own very soul being troubled by what was ahead, Jesus tells us that his coming death being "lifted up" on the cross was to save us and glorify God's name. God the Father responds with a loud voice and clap of thunder affirming Jesus.

We must ask ourselves, what in our lives needs to die so that God may be glorified. What of the world's life do we need to die to, so that we might serve our Saviour and gain the life that will mean eternal life with the Father Son and Holy Spirit in glory.

We are promised that in dying to the world we will spring up to produce a rich harvest for the Kingdom.

We Pray, that we may have the discernment to know what in our lives must die, so that God may be glorified and we may produce a rich harvest of other lives knowing the saving grace of Jesus.

We will keep you up to date via the weekly newsletter with our plans as they evolve.


