Readings: Genesis 9:8-15 1 Peter 3:18-22 Mark 1:12-15

Ash Wednesday and The Season of Lent

Ash Wednesday is important because it marks the start of the Lenten period leading up to Easter. The ashes symbolize both death and repentance. During this period, Christians show repentance and mourning for their sins, because they believe Christ died for them. The first day of Lent is Ash Wednesday and Christians wear a marking of the cross in ash on their foreheads. The ashes symbolize our mortality – "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Forty is typically indicative of a time of testing, trial, penance, purification, and renewal. In the New Testament, forty days is the length of Jesus' time of trial in the desert in preparation for his public ministry, proclaiming the Gospel.

Recall Jesus' saying, "Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the road broad that leads to destruction, and those who enter through it are many. Entering through that "narrow gate" is a path that requires resolve and sacrificial love. To take that constricted and challenging road, we must face difficult aspects of our lives, including our sins.

Lent is the time to realize how precious is our life and how seriously we must live it and live it in love, to appreciate this world, our self and the people around us. Lent is a time of being with the Lord and with the people. "Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the good news of God and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the Kingdom of God has come near; repent and believe in the good news." We know from the Gospels that John the Baptist was arrested because, apart from courageously telling Herod how he was wrong in keeping his brother's wife, John had also challenged the existing political and religious powers. He preached to the people repentance of sin and asked them to turn away from evil.

In the Bible we have two clear evidence of temptations: one taking place in the Garden of Eden (The First Parents) and the other in the desert (Jesus). Lent is the time to put an end to some of our self-indulgent illusions. It is the time to realize how precious our life is and how seriously we have to live it; live it in love, to appreciate this world, our self and the people around us.

Like John, Jesus not only preached repentance but pointed out wrongs committed by the Pharisees and the Sadducees. Throughout the Gospels we find Him challenging the powerful. Pope Francis has been reminding everyone to go back to the Gospels and to be more like Jesus.

Today the Gospel also tells us about Satan's attempt to distract and tempt Jesus by offering Him all kinds of excuses and allurements, including bread, the most necessity for survival, to move away from His determination, vocation, and ultimate mission. One wonders if Satan did not already know he would not succeed. There is one little but important details worth considering in today's Gospel narrative, i.e., "He was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and He was with the wild beasts..." And wild beasts are treacherous, to say the least. Jesus was not afraid of wild beasts. I wish you a good Lenten Season to be with the Lord and the people around.

FAITH MATTERS: Lent

Lent has begun – a time of prayer, fasting and alms-giving to help us realise the relationship of love that Jesus offers us on the cross.

A few quotes about Lent from Pope Francis:

'The Lenten practices of almsgiving, prayer and fasting are not mere external practices; they are paths that lead to the heart, to the core of the Christian life. Christians are called in Lent to love the brothers and sisters all around us, to be considerate to others, to feel compassion, to show mercy, to share all that we are and all that we have with those in need.'

'Lent is an occasion for conversion and internal renewal through listening to the Word of God, caring for brothers and sisters who need our help, and prayer, especially to obtain the grace of peace in the world.'

'Prayer, almsgiving, and fasting are not three unrelated exercises, but a single movement of openness and selfemptying. We cast out the idols that weigh us down and the attachments that imprison us. Then will our atrophied and isolated heart revive.'

¹Do you want to fast this Lent? Fast from hurting words and say kind words. Fast from sadness and be filled with gratitude. Fast from anger and be filled with patience. Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope. Fast from worries and have trust in God. Fast from complaints, contemplate simplicity. Fast from pressures and be prayerful. Fast from bitterness, fill your hearts with joy. Fast from selfishness and be compassionate. Fast from grudges and be reconciled. Fast from words be silent and listen.'

wisdom to navigate difficult times and to find a way forward. Give your people the courage to be peacemakers, and guide them toward peace. Amen.


