### The extension of St Peter's Columbarium

About a quarter of a century ago, our parish team made a great and wise decision to create our own columbarium. After considerable discussion and preparation, the construction of the new columbarium, or the Memorial Wall and Garden, was completed in 1997. It is situated on the western side of the church.

Since its establishment, our beautiful Memorial Wall and Garden have provided permanent resting places for many parishioners or their family members. The Columbarium is always maintained in a clean and dignified condition, managed and cared for by a group of wonderful parishioners, currently co-ordinated by Mal Jensen.

The Columbarium provides niches for interred remains, as well as space for plaques to commemorate those who are buried elsewhere. Visitors to the Wall or the Garden can take the time to pray for the repose of the souls of their loved ones.

For so many years, in our parish, the columbarium has kept the tradition of the Catholic Church to provide its members with a sacred site as a final resting place. It is a warm place for many parishioners, a place to be reminded of their loved ones, and a place for them to pray, remember and reflect. Our parish has been blessed with this special place. We thank our parish team in those early days for contributing such a wonderful idea and putting it into practice.

As you might be aware, there is only one Memorial Wall, and the niches are limited. With the passing of the years, many niches have been occupied and the vacant ones are becoming fewer. There are four types of niches in our memorial wall: small single, large single, small double and large double. The large double niche is the most popular one. There was a time when only three double niches remained. As an urgent and quick solution, last year we decided to convert 18 small single ones into six large double ones.

With respect to the Memorial Garden, all places have been occupied, and thus we have not been able to offer places in the garden for some time. Therefore, our parish team has decided to build a second memorial wall and to allocate some land around the wall as the added memorial garden.

In February this year, a council of the Columbarium project was formed. The members include myself, the chairperson of PFC, the co-ordinator of maintenance & works committee and two members of memorial Wall and Garden ministry group. The co-ordinator of lay ministries has been invited to the meetings as well. With the hard work of this council, great progress has been made. The design of the project has been completed, the required quotes have been acquired, and a builder has been confirmed. Most importantly, this project has been approved by the Archbishop. The date of the commencement of the project has been set, and the work will begin on the 19th of September, the first day of the school holidays.

Dear friends, in two weeks time, the members of the Columbarium Project Council will hold information sessions for those who are interested. More details will be available along with the design and construction arrangements that will be made. Please support our parish with this new project. With the construction of the second memorial wall and garden, we believe our parish will become an even better spiritual family for all, the living as well as for those who have died. *Fr Baiyi*

## Faith Matters: ST BERNARD OF CLAIRVAUX

St. Bernard of Clairvaux, was born 1090, near Dijon, Burgundy in France and died August 20, 1153, at Clairvaux, Champagne. He was canonized January 18, 1174. He was a Cistercian monk and mystic, founder and abbot of the abbey of Clairvaux and one of the most influential churchmen of his time. In 1115, he was appointed to lead a small group of monks to establish a monastery at Clairvaux, on the borders of Burgundy and Champagne. Four brothers, under the leadership of Bernard endured extreme deprivations for well over a decade before Clairvaux was self-sufficient. Meanwhile, as Bernard's health worsened, his spirituality deepened.

His first writings were characterized by repetition of references to the Church Fathers and are imbued with resonance and poetic genius. He produced a small but complete treatise on Mariology (study of doctrines and dogmas concerning the Virgin Mary), "Praises of the Virgin Mother." Bernard was to become a major champion of a moderate cult of the Virgin. A famous painting shows Bernard in mysticism drinking of the milk of Mary. His more than 300 letters and sermons manifest his quest to combine a mystical life of absorption in God with his friendship for those in misery.

As the confidant of five popes, he considered it his role to assist in healing the church of wounds inflicted by the antipopes to oppose the rationalistic influence of the greatest and most popular dialectician of the age, Peter Abelard, and to cultivate the friendship of the greatest churchmen of the time. He believed one seeks God by learning to live in a school of charity and not through "scandalous curiosity," he held. "Possession of love is the first condition of the knowledge of God." He exhorted Pope Eugenius to stress his role as spiritual leader of the church over his role as leader of a great temporal power, and he was a major figure in church councils. His greatest literary endeavour was "Sermons on the Canticle of Canticles," It revealed his teaching, often described as "sweet as honey,". It was a love song supreme: "The Father is never fully known if He is not loved perfectly." Add to this one of Bernard's favourite prayers, "Whence arises the love of God? From God. And what is the measure of this love? To love without measure,". St. Bernard was declared a doctor of the church in 1830. *Faith Enrichment Ministry*
