Pray for the children who are on their sacramental journey

Every year, there are many children in our parish who receive three very important sacraments: Confirmation, Reconciliation, and Eucharist. According to the Sacramental Policy of the Archdiocese of Brisbane, revised in September 2015, children who have turned 8 years old, or are in grade three or above, should be prepared to be Confirmed. In the following year, the children will receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation with the Second Rite for the first time, as a part of preparation for the reception of their First Holy Communion which follows shortly after. This is not the end of their Sacramental journey. The children are encouraged to come back the year after to receive Reconciliation with the First Rite. Then they will be treated like other parishioners, being encouraged to receive the Eucharist and Reconciliation as regularly as possible.

At St Peter's Parish, our sacramental team usually start the journey of the children for the Sacrament of Confirmation in June each year. After a period of preparation, the sacrament is usually celebrated on the last Friday of August.

Usually in May the following year, we start the preparation for those children confirmed the previous year to receive their First Holy Communion, which will be celebrated in June on the feast of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Christ.

During Lent of the year after that, the parish will arrange a suitable time to invite back those who received their First Holy Communion during the previous year. With the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation with the First Rite, they can understand God's love, forgiveness and mercy better and more deeply. Also, we can help them develop a good habit of reflecting on their lives according to the teaching of Jesus and seeking God's forgiveness of their sins through the Sacrament of Reconciliation on a regular basis. This Sacramental journey which covers 3 years should give them the ability to grow in God's love and goodness to become a better person every single day.

Every year, our parish follows this cycle and many children have spiritually benefited from the sacramental journey guided by our parish team.

This May, our parish has started the preparation for the children who were Confirmed last year. As we could not have sacramental programs in 2020 due to COVID-19, the number of children who received Confirmation was doubled in 2021. That is why there were around 60 children who are on the journey towards to the reception of the First Holy Communion in 2022. Last Sunday, most of these children, together with their parents, attended 9am Mass. During the Mass, they officially enrolled themselves into the program. Through the Rite of Enrolment, the children committed themselves to prepare for the Sacraments. Their parents and our parishioners expressed their ongoing support and prayers for them. The church was packed and the celebration was very successful.

Dear friends, as we all know, the sacramental journey is very important for the faith formation of the children. Please continue to support them and keep them in your daily prayers. Also, let us thank God for our wonderful Sacramental Program ministry team, coordinated by Stephanie Lenihan.

Faith Matters: Our Lady Help of Christians

The feast day to Mary Help of Christians has been celebrated in Australia since 1844 but the history to this day dates back to the start of the 1800's. Napoleon Bonaparte had jailed Pius VI who died in jail. When Pope Pius VII was elected, he too was jailed by Bonaparte, who kept him prisoner at Fontainebleau.

The Holy Father vowed to God that if he were restored to the Roman See, he would institute a special feast in honour of Mary. The military eventually forced Bonaparte to release the Pope and on 24 May 1814, Pius VII returned in triumph to Rome. Twelve months later the Pope decreed that the feast of Mary Help of Christians be kept on 24 May 1815.

The infant church in Australia had a special reason for turning to Mary. No priests were sent to the colony, and the Rosary in those early days helped to keep the faith alive.

Australia became the first country to have Mary Help of Christians as Patroness, it became the first country to have a mother-cathedral under the same title. The statue of Mary, Help of Christians, stands in the Chapel of the Sacred Heart in St Mary's Cathedral in Sydney, Australia's oldest Cathedral.

In the Opening Prayer for Our Lady Help of Christians, we pray; -

"Almighty God, deepen in our hearts our love of Mary Help of Christians. Through her prayers and under her protection, may the light of Christ shine over our land." Reference: - Catholic Weekly 2012
