MISSION STATEMENT

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord (Year B) 24th March 2024

Readings: *Entrance into Jerusalem:* Mark 11:1-10 Isaiah 50:4-7 Philippians 2:6-11 Mark 14:1-15:47

The Holy Week (Passion Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter)

Passion Sunday is that Sunday in which we tell the world that there was a man named Jesus of Nazareth, who stepped forward from the line, and took the assassin's bullet so his friends would not have to die. Why? Because He taught us these famous words "No greater love has a person than this, that he laid down his life for the other." That is what passion is. On this Sunday Christ is hailed as King. They sang aloud 'Hosana' and the whole Jerusalem stood still at the majestic entry of this King and the whole town trembled at the din of this royal procession.

As we move forward, we find that Jesus, foreseeing His painful journey, betrayal, goes to pray and asks His disciples to do the same. To His utter frustration He finds that they are all sleeping. Is it merely because their spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak or is it a kind of un-interest in prayer itself?

Holy Thursday: The important events of the day are, washing the feet of his disciples, institution of the Holy Eucharist, and the giving of the great commandment, "for I have given you an example, that you should do as I have done to you." It was this care for the details in love that we see in the activities that Jesus did on Holy Thursday. The details of love include humbling oneself, sharing the meal and raising others to a higher status.

Good Friday: Today, we make a journey with Jesus through his suffering, crucifixion, and death. We meet a lot of people in this journey who travelled with the Lord both positively and negatively. We meet Pontius Pilate and the authorities who condemned the Lord to death, Judas who betrayed the Lord and Peter was bold enough to say that he did not know Jesus. We meet people who supported the Lord like; Simon who helped Jesus to carry the cross, Veronica who wiped the face of the Lord, the women of Jerusalem who showed sympathy to the Lord and Nicodemus and Joseph of Arimathea who did bury the body of the Lord. We also meet Mary our mother and many more women and disciples. God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise and what is weak in the world to confound the strong.

Easter: One of the great feasts of the Christian Faith is Easter, the Resurrection of the Lord. It is a guarantee for all of us that if we follow the commandment of the Lord, we all will be surely given the grace of eternal life. The empty tomb is God's way of saying to us, "Relax, my child, I took the sting, death can't hurt you anymore. You too can have eternal life.

Holy Week offers us a good opportunity to go through each of those incidents meditatively and put our own selves in those or similar situations. I am sure that they would help us a great deal to make a deeper commitment to the suffering Jesus and the Risen Lord. We need to travel with the Lord in this Holy Week as we are called to be real followers of Jesus Christ, who is hailed king, crucified, died and risen.

FAITH MATTERS: God's Idea of Love

I recently heard a long-term Christian acquaintance say that Jesus' call for us not to ask for things back when someone steals from us, and to "turn the other cheek", was a load of rubbish! He refused to accept these notions as reasonable. He wants to see 'justice' done.

My understanding is that it's all about Love. God's kind of Love, not our self-oriented human concept of what real love is. It's clearly not based on making sure we are not taken advantage of. Or on our standing in regard to the principle of 'justice'.

Was it 'just' from God's point of view that He should come into this world to pay the price for our efforts at self-determination? Was Jesus experiencing 'justice' when he was challenged, rebuked, vilified, rejected and brutally killed by the very people who claimed to represent God's nature and call in this world?

Perhaps it was because of a kind of love that involves great humility, and an over-arching desire to give those who are not following God's ways more opportunity to rethink their attitudes, and to turn back to the God of all that is good.

Acting without animosity, but with *generosity*. toward someone who wrongs us is more likely to make them stop and think, than if we retaliate. Retaliation is not only the typical response, but can also easily lead to an escalation of wrongs.

Does this mean we should never challenge wrongs done to us or others? I don't think so. But the desire to see everyone and everything brought into God's light and healing, is surely paramount. If our heart is truly for God, and for the spiritual well-being of our fellow human beings, then we can be assured of God's care for us, no matter what.
