The 109th World Day of Migrants and Refugees 2023

Free to choose whether to migrate or stay

For the World Day of Migrants and Refugees Pope Francis has written a letter under the title : " *Free to choose whether to migrate or to stay.*" According to our Pope, the decision to migrate should always be free, yet in many cases it is not. Forced migration is an ancient phenomenon. Pope Francis refers to the Book of Genesis when Jacob, during a great famine, had to migrate with his entire family to Egypt. Also, the flight of the Holy Family was not a free decision but made out of fear of the persecution by Herod.

Today, wars, civil unrests, persecutions as well as natural disasters make it impossible for millions of people to live a dignified life in one's native homeland. According to the UNHCR (United Nation's High Commissioner for Refugees), as of May 2023, more than 108.4 million people were forcibly displaced. This number represents men, women and children who brave long, desperate journeys to safety. The Pope reminds us to see in the migrant and refugee not simply a brother or sister but Christ himself, who knocks at our door. These are Jesus' words from the Gospel of Matthew 25:35: "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me,"

For migrants and refugees, whenever they reach a place of safety, it is important to find a community ready to welcome, to promote and to intergrate them. However, the unending waves of refugees pose enormous challenges. Many nations are no longer able to provide the help and assistance needed. Pope Francis suggests far reaching changes in our world but they take time. In the meantime we are asked to manage migration as best as we can and to build bridges not walls.

The central place in the entire migrant and refugee debate is for prayer to reflect on what we can do. First of all Australia has and is welcoming people from many different nationalities. Today, it is home to the oldest culture in the world and to more than 270 ancestries. Since 1945 seven million people have migrated to Australia. We can continue to build our Australian society upon the principle of inclusion of people of all cultural backgrounds. Here, each and everyone of us has a role to play in our suburbs, in our workplace, in our church and in our nation. We can also financially support the work of the UNHCR that works in many world trouble spots. Money cannot buy happiness but just a little can radically change someone's life. The Mercy Community Romero Centre in Dutton Park, in Brisbane, also deserves our assistance as it supports asylum seekers. We cannot help everyone but everyone can help someone. Pope Francis concludes his letter with this thought: "**Only by walking together will we be able to go far and reach the common goal of our journey.**"



FAITH MATTERS: St Vincent de Paul (27th Sept)

St. Vincent de Paul, born in 1581 in France, is celebrated as a revered figure in Catholicism and humanitarianism. His life's work has left an indelible mark on the world, embodying the principles of compassion, service, and charity.
