Readings: Genesis 22:1-2,9-13,15-18 Romans 8:31-34 Mark 9:2-10

Transfiguration of Jesus

Transfiguration is the occasion upon which Jesus Christ took three of his disciples, Peter, James, and John, up on a mountain, where Moses and Elijah appeared and Jesus was transfigured, his face and clothes becoming dazzlingly bright. According to tradition, the event took place on Mount Tabor. The Transfiguration is also referenced in the Second Letter of Peter, where Peter's presence as an eyewitness to Christ's majesty is used to assure the readers that his message is true (1:16–18). The Transfiguration is understood to have been the revelation of the eternal glory of the second person of the Trinity, which was normally veiled during Christ's life on earth. The event can also be interpreted as an anticipatory Resurrection appearance, and the presence of the two prophets is often taken to signify Christ's fulfillment of the Mosaic Law and the prophecies of the Hebrew Bible.

One question that can immediately crop up in one's mind after reading the Transfiguration passage is why Jesus chose only Peter, James, and John to accompany Him to the high mountain to witness His Transfiguration, when He had a number of other apostles and disciples? The next question, even more important than the first, would be with regard to the need for such a Transfiguration before the three men; and finally, why, as they were coming down the mountain, were they told not to tell anyone about the incident until after Jesus had risen from the dead?

Jesus said to them in the same place "The Son of Man is going to be delivered into the hands of men. They will kill Him, and after three days He will rise." And again, we find, "But they did not understand what He meant and were afraid to ask Him about it." Things become even more complicated for the disciples when Jesus tells them that He will be delivered over into the hands of men who will kill Him. Killing? In such a situation the disciples need some astonishing event about Jesus to hold on to Him until, of course, the event of the resurrection. The Transfiguration is only a kind of a preview of the glory that the Son of Man will be bestowed with, sitting on the right hand of God.

We do not know how long the Transfiguration lasts; but here the question is not of days, hours, and minutes but of that indescribable experience which they can remember at the time of His suffering. And yet we find that, when Jesus does face trouble, the disciples all disappear. They get their courage back only after His resurrection when they are ready to sacrifice their lives. While resurrection confirms the truth of the claims made by Jesus about being the Son of God and that the Father and He are one, the Transfiguration is only a glimpse of His authenticity as coming from heaven.

It is important for us to remember that while our God is mighty and strong and capable of performing the impossible for us. He also allows suffering, pain, and persecution. He, Himself went to the extent of dying a shameful death. Transfiguration of the Lord is the guarantee for all our pains, sufferings if we face them with the true Christian Faith.

FAITH MATTERS: Reflection on the Transfiguration

Today's Gospel relates the amazing transformation of the appearance of Jesus on a high mountain where Jesus had taken Peter, James, and John. What we call the Transfiguration not only involved the transformation of Jesus' appearance in the presence of Moses and Elijah, but also the very voice of God confirming Jesus as his Son and the command to "Listen to Him".

Even though he was terrified, Peter obviously experienced a great emotional high; a "Mountain Top Experience". Peter didn't seem to want to leave and suggested building three tents or shelters as holy places as if to prolong the amazing spiritual experience. This thought is interrupted by the Father God affirming Jesus as God's Son and commands them to listen to him.

They descend the mountain, and in Luke's version, at the bottom they find a man whose son needs healing from demon possession. There is work to do, blessings to give as Jesus heals the lad.

Perhaps we have experienced these high spiritual moments which we would like to prolong and linger in, whether in prayer, spiritual reflection or just in sheer joy and exhilaration. We must remember however that it is necessary to descend from our Mountain Top Experience and share the blessings to those below for there is Christ's work of making disciples, baptizing, and teaching to be done, as he has told us to do in the Great Commission (*Matthew 28 19-20*).

We Pray, that our lives may also be transformed so that we may bring the blessing of Christ to others.
