### Be another Christ during this Lent

"Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. And after fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry. And the tempter came and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command these stones to become loaves of bread." But he answered, "It is written, "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God."

**Lenten Prayer:** O Lord and Master of my life! Take from me the spirit of laziness, faint-heartedness, desire for power, and idle talk. But give your servant the spirit of chastity, humility, patience, and love. Yes, Lord and King! Grant me to see my own errors and not to judge my brother and sister unjustly or hastily, for you are blessed, now and forever. Amen. (St. Ephrem)

Lent is a period of penitential preparation for Easter, and it begins on Ash Wednesday. In the early centuries, fasting rules were very strict, as they still are in Eastern churches. One meal a day was allowed in the evening, and meat, fish, eggs, and butter were forbidden. Millions of people do this during Lent as a sign of sacrifice and to test their self-discipline. Christians believe that this is to represent Jesus Christ's sacrifice when He went into the desert to pray and fast for the 40 days before later dying on the cross.

Why is Lent so important to Christians? Lent is a season of reflection and preparation before the celebrations of Easter. By observing the 40 days of Lent, Christians replicate Jesus Christ's sacrifice and withdrawal into the desert for 40 days. For Lent, the Church gives us almost a slogan—**Prayer**, **Fasting**, **and Almsgiving**—as the three things we need to work on during the season. We are challenged to be another Christ in the present world here and now.

In a Hasidic story, an atheist persistently tried to catch a village rabbi in theological snares but always failed. One day the atheist asked: Rabbi, is it true that God knows everything? Yes, my son, said the Rabbi, God knows everything. Rabbi, the atheist continued, is it also true that after the fall, God asked Adam, Adam, where are you? Yes, my son, that is also true, said the Rabbi. The atheist smiled, thinking that he had finally caught the Rabbi in contradiction, and asked: But, Rabbi, if God knows everything why did God have to ask Adam where he was? My son, replied the Rabbi, Adam, where are you is not a question for information **but for reflection.** 

"Where am I?" is a perennial question of life, which encompasses many other questions. What am I doing? Does it have any purpose or lasting significance? What does it all mean? These questions and those like them distil into this haunting question: When I come to die will it make any difference that I have ever lived? Lent is the time to put an end to some of our self-indulgent illusions. It is the time to realize how precious is our life and how seriously we must live it; live it in love, to appreciate this world, our self, and the people around us.

#### Faith Matters: FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT - 2023

Last year, I studied a course called "The way of beauty". It basically looked at how God communicates to us through the beauty in the world around us - visual, aural, touch, taste - God being the greatest beauty that there is and the source of all beauty. In a question and answer session, the question arose as to why, if God is the source of all beauty and that Jesus is God the son, why was there basically nothing written about the beauty of Jesus, while there is much mentioned about the beauty of Jesus. After all much has been written about the beauty of Mary his mother and especially in her many apparitions.

One possible explanation that was delivered was that Jesus, by his passion and death, took on all the weight and ugliness of sin in the world. "Therefore, just as through one man sin entered into the world, and death through sin, and so death spread to all mankind, because all sinned— Romans 5:12

Sin results in ugliness, pain and severe isolation.

During Lent, we strive to break the habits of sin in our lives. We take extra steps to be people of praise, dependence on God, people who strive towards God and away from sin, and people of forgiveness.

May we prepare well during Lent to rid our lives of sin and so celebrate the resurrection – by challenging ourselves out of being too comfortable and self-centred.


The Summit will create a place where each person can encounter Christ, be formed in faith, and equipped for the mission we are called to.
