MISSION STATEMENT

"Saint Peter's Parish is a community who lives in faith of Jesus Christ and, moved by the Spirit, continues to grow in our love for God and all people."

Fifth Sunday of Easter (Year B) 28th April 2024

Readings: Acts 9:26-31 1 John 3:18-24 John 15:1-8

Abiding in Jesus' Love

John 15:1-8: Jesus teaches that he is the vine and that his disciples are the branches. The Gospel of John is part of Jesus' discourse at the Last Supper. John tells the story of Jesus' Last Supper differently from others. In John's Gospel, the Last Supper begins with Jesus washing his disciples' feet. Jesus then provides them with a series of instructions. This is Jesus' farewell discourse. In these chapters of John's Gospel, Jesus instructs his disciples about the importance of following his example of love and service, about the gift they will receive when Jesus sends them the Holy Spirit, and about their relationship with Jesus and with the world. The Last Supper discourse concludes with Jesus' prayer for his disciples.

Jesus teaches his disciples that his relationship with them will not end after his death, and he will remain with them always. This unity between Jesus and his disciples is the basis for their ability to continue to do the work that he began. Similarly, Jesus' presence with us through the Gift of the Holy Spirit enables us to continue the work of love and reconciliation that he began.

I do not think that there is any better image of the Christian life in the Gospel than this. "If a person remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit". I find this image of what it means to be a True Christian. There is so much grace in these words for people who are tired out from all their work or discouraged by the fact that they do not feel they are good enough for God or that they have not done enough for Him.

Even obedience to the Law of God, that obedience which, as we were told in the Book of Deuteronomy leads to abundant prosperity and blessings upon the land. All we need do to be fruitful is remain a part of the vine and perform the simple tasks that every branch performs as a means of maintaining a fruitful life in the vine.

It reminds us of all that we need to do to be pleasing to God. First – just as we receive energy from God and accept from him the light, in the same way we need to be exposed to the word of God, we need daily contact with the light it sheds, we need to hold his teachings in our minds and in our hearts so that we might draw from them the strength and energy we need.

Second - the branch is connected to the stem or trunk, receiving from it the nutrients and moisture that it needs. The connection is established by God, and it is maintained by us through the way of faith and prayer. When Jesus said, "I am the true vine, and you are branches", he also said - "no branch can bear fruit by itself, it must remain in the vine".

St. Augustine once asked this question: what does love look like? He says, love has hands to help others. It has feet to hasten the poor and needy. It has eyes to see misery and want. It has ears to hear the sighs and sorrows of others. That is what love looks like. Therefore, remain in the love of Jesus always.

FAITH MATTERS: St Zita of Lucca - a serving Saint

This week we reflect on an obscure but relatable 13th Century Saint.

Born of a poor but devout Italian family she became a house-keeper and servant in the house of rich weaver where she was harshly treated. Despite hard working conditions she made time every day to attend Mass, and to pray often. She was gracious and conscientious in spite of the conditions and jealousy of some of her fellow servants.

Her employers gave her a hard time over her gifts of food to the poor but in time they were won over by her patience and goodness and gave her time to also visit the sick and poor. God blessed her work and she became well known in the community for her works. She died in 1278 and was canonized in 1696. Some 150 miracles are attributed to her, and it is said that her body suffered no corruption. It may be seen at the Basilica of San Frediano in Lucca. Her Feast Day is the 27th April.

Her very "ordinary" life reflecting hard work, patience and graciousness stand out for we ordinary people, rather than any mighty works of statesmanship or theological insight and is a very good example to us in living our daily lives whilst still serving God and being as Christ to others.

We pray: Lord, give us the grace and insight to see how our ordinary daily lives may be made an instrument of your peace and service to the world.
