### Social Justice Sunday 2022

The Australian Institute of Health and Welfare reports that "Family, domestic and sexual violence is a major health and welfare issue. It occurs across all ages, and all socioeconomic and demographic groups, but predominantly affects women and children." (www.aihw.gov.au) Have we reflected and engaged with this social reality?

The statement explores the roots of violence and abuse and honours the voices of victims. Rosie Batty, the 2015 Australian of the Year eloquently describes the complexity of the issue. An Aboriginal woman implores us not to see victims of violence as numbers but as living human beings, as mothers, grandmothers and aunties.

The Statement offers a social and theological exploration of the reality of violence, especially against women and children and invites us to develop relationships in all parts of our lives," marked by equality and reciprocity rather than domination and violence, respect and freedom rather than coercion and control." Are we familiar with drivers and enablers of abuse?

The Australian Bishops have added their voices to global campaigns to control and call out destructive attitudes and behaviours that lead to life- limiting and long-lasting impacts on many vulnerable members of our families, churches and society. The Bishops invite us to investigate the scope, drivers, and enablers of abuse. Inequality between men and women is central to the problem. There are no equal social structures between men and women. Men enjoy more power, resources and opportunities, and their voices, ideas and worth are valued more highly by society.

The Statement focusses in a special way on the problem of spiritual violence and abuse. It discusses how religious teachings - including our own - may be manipulated by perpetrators to excuse violence or to exert control over others. According to the Statement some Christian men use the excuse that the Bible gives them an entitlement to be the head of the household and control women and children. Today, the church categorically proclaims that women are not subservient to their husbands, women should not suffer abuse in silence. Marriage is a relationship of love and partnership.

As a Faith community how can we work towards individual and social transformation?

The Statement calls for faith communities to believe and support those who are going through domestic violence and to hold perpetrators to account and to work towards individual and social transformation. Finally, the Statement acknowledges the work done by faith communities and organisations such as Catholic Health Australia, Caritas Australia and Catholic Social Services Australia across the country, as well as by many diocesan and grass-root organisations. Great work is being done for example by Catholic Care Broken Bay's Safe Homes, Choosing Orange in the Archdiocese of Sydney, Red Dust Healing for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander men and many more.

In its Conclusion, the Statement calls on all of us to place "greater attention to respect for the dignity of each person made in the image and likeness of God and the equality in Christ of all people, imitation of Christ like quality of respect and care for all people especially the poorest and most vulnerable, and the practise of the virtues of justice and solidarity can enable us to be more true to the Good News of Jesus."

We sing the words of many hymns to thank God for the wondrous gifts of creation, made from the very breath of God and the work of God's hands.
