# Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A)

29th October 2023

Readings: Exodus 22:20-26 1 Thesalonians 1:5-10 Matthew 22:34-40

### 7th World Day of the Poor

Pope Francis, on the 7th World Day of the Poor, issues a resounding call to action, urging solidarity and advocacy for the impoverished. He emphasizes the directive: "Do not turn your face away from anyone who is poor" (*Tobit 4:7*), since neglecting the poor risks missing an encounter with Jesus. The Pope observes our inclination to shield ourselves from the harsh realities of poverty, its causes and effects, and calls on Christians to work alongside the poor. He cites the example provided by Tobit, who, despite suffering injustice, blindness, and poverty himself, by word and deed instilled in his son a devotion to God complemented by generosity to the destitute. The Pope urges us to engage in generous faith-filled giving since everyone in need is our neighbour in Christ, regardless of background.

The UN's World Inequality Report 2022 reveals a stark global income gap that demonstrates the validity of the Pope's observation that poverty has grown like a "great river...swelling to the point of overflowing." The top 10% now command over 50% of global income, while the bottom 50% receive a mere 2% - a 6% decline since 2021. In September 2023, the University of NSW reported an alarming surge in wealth inequality and poverty in Australia, with the wealthiest growing 82 times faster than the poorest.

The Pope delineates the causes and consequences of poverty, spotlighting how war strips individuals of their health, livelihoods, and dignity. He urges a collective effort to promote peace and justice. Pope Francis addresses the dearth of hope among young people often unfairly labeled and denied the support they need to thrive as adults.

He also identifies the agonizing choices faced by many poor individuals when confronted with rising prices, driven up by speculation and greed. The poor often grapple with decisions between vital needs like food and healthcare. He condemns the profit-centric mindset that causes mistreatment and underpayment of workers and escalating job insecurity. Echoing Saint John Paul II's conviction that work should serve humanity, the Pope says that we should be pressuring public institutions to fulfill their duty to alleviate poverty while also taking concrete grassroots action as individuals, families, and communities working in collaboration with the poor.

He expresses gratitude for those dedicated to aiding the marginalized, asserting that they breathe life into the Kingdom of God through selfless service. At St. Peter's, we celebrate the efforts of St. Vincent de Paul, The Social Justice and Care and Concern Groups, and Fr. Johny and his team. However, Pope Francis contends that more must be done, cautioning against relegating charity to others and stresses that it is the responsibility of every Christian to be personally engaged.

In conclusion, Pope Francis underscores that by serving the poor, we experience the transformative force of giving and receiving mercy and charity. Poverty corrodes self-worth, impedes progress, and undermines societal cohesion. Gandhi's words, "poverty is the worst form of violence," hold true, and Pope Francis' reflections emphasize its insidious nature. On the other hand, as Christians, it is our duty to spread love and benevolence. When we share, we are thanking God and standing against the shadows. Pope Francis asks each of us to embody Gospel-based love and charity, ensuring that no one is left behind as we journey forward together.
